ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

SUMMIT CHARTER SCHOOL, WEST CAMPUS, INC.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes Chapter 617, does hereby make and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE 1 - NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of the Corporation is: Summit Charter School, West Campus, Inc.

ARTICLE II- PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND MAILING ADDRESS

The principal office of the Corporation and the current mailing address of the Corporation is:

6101 Denson Drive

Orlando, Florida 32808

ARTICLE III- TERM AND COMMENCEMENT

Corporate existence shall commence on ______, and the term of the Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV - GENERAL PURPOSE AND BUSINESS

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are as follows:

A. To receive and administer funds and to operate exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or comparable versions of subsequent legislation, as amended (the "Code"). Principal among those purposes is: to operate one or more "Charter Schools" within various counties in the State of Florida, pursuant to Chapter 96-186, Laws of Florida (eff. July 1, 1996) [the "Charter School Legislation"]. The Charter Schools operated by the Corporation shall be public schools and will receive some portion of funds for operation from public monies allocated to the respective County School Board

for operation of the public school systems, all pursuant to and as provided in said Charter School Legislation.

B. The mission of the Summit Charter School, West Campus, Inc. will remediate learning disabilities in elementary school children through use of an integrated instructional program, combining the kinesthetic, sensory and cognitive aspects of learning, and to permanently close the "academic gap" with mainstream students during such children's elementary school years. The Summit Charter School may also support, sponsor and conduct cognitive and neurocognitive intervention studies and research related to primary and secondary learning and language disabilities, developmental and acquired reading and writing disabilities, perceptual and neurocognitive impairments and socio-economic-cultural learning disabilities.

C. To acquire, own, purchase, lease, dispose of and deal with real and personal property and interests, either absolutely or in trust therein, for the purposes of operating or conducting Summit Charter Schools therefrom, and further to apply gifts, grants, bequests, and devises and the proceeds thereof in furtherance of the foregoing Purposes.

D. To engage in and transact any other lawful activity, solely in furtherance of the foregoing Purposes, for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act and any successive laws or amendments thereto; and to do all other things as are incidental or necessary to the exercise of the powers of the Corporation in order to accomplish the foregoing Purposes.

ARTICLE V-NO MEMBERS

The Corporation shall not have members and shall not issue membership certificates.

ARTICLE VI-INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT AND OFFICE

The initial registered agent is Kenneth Gluckman and the initial registered office is located at

ARTICLE VII - NOT FOR PROFIT

The Corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the Corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of the Directors or Officers, except to the extent permissible under these Articles, under law and under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. If the Corporation ever has members, no member shall have any vested right, interest or privilege in or to the assets, income or property of the Corporation and no part of the income or assets of the Corporation shall be distributable to or for the benefit of its members, except to the extent permissible under these Articles, under law and under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE VIII - POWERS

The Corporation shall have all of the common law and statutory powers of a corporation not for profit pursuant to the laws of the State of Florida that are not in conflict with the terms of these Articles; provided, however, that notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or any corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue law.

ARTICLE IX - LIMITATIONS

The Corporation shall be operated exclusively for educational, charitable, or scientific purposes as a nonprofit corporation. No individual director or member of the corporation shall have any title to or interest in the corporate property or earnings in his or her individual or private capacity. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of or be distributable to its Directors of Officers, (or members if the corporation has any), but the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the Purposes set forth in Article IV hereof.

ARTICLE XIII - BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the Corporation are to be made and adopted by the Board of Directors, and may be altered, amended or rescinded by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIV - AMENDMENT

The Corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provisions contained in these Articles of Incorporation or any amendment to them.

ARTICLE XV - NON STOCK BASIS

The Corporation is organized (and shall be operated) on a non-stock basis within the meaning of the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, and shall not have the power to issue shares of any type or class of stock, but may issue membership certificates if so provided in the bylaws.

ARTICLE XVI - TAX EXEMPT STATUS

It is intended that the Corporation shall have and continue to have the status of a corporation that is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the Code as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and which is other than a private foundation as defined in Section 509 of the Code. These Articles shall be construed accordingly, and all powers and activities of the Corporation shall be limited accordingly. The Corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation or to engage in political activity on behalf of or in opposition to candidates for public office, to such extent as would result in the loss of exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE XVII - DISSOLUTION.

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation, distribute all the assets of the Corporation exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes in such manner and to such qualified organization or organizations as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so distributed shall be distributed in accordance with the direction of any court having jurisdiction in the county

in which principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for the aforesaid Purposes of the Corporation or to such qualified organization(s) as said court shall determine. For purposes of this Article, an organization is a "qualified organization" only if, at the time of receiving such assets, it is operated exclusively for the purposes described in Section 170(c)(1) or 170(c)(B) of the code and is described in Section 509(a)(1), or (2) or (3) of said code.

ARTICLE XVIII- INDEMNIFICATION AND CIVIL LIABILITY IMMUNITY

The Corporation shall indemnify each Director and officer, including former Directors and Officers, to the fullest extent allowed by law, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 617, subject to the Charter School Legislation. It is intended that the Corporation be an Organization of the Officers and Directors of which are immune from Civil liability to the extent provided under Florida Statutes Chapter 617.
