ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

NEUROLOGIC EDUCATION, TREATMENT,

AND RESEARCH FOUNDATION, INC

(a Not-For-Profit Corporation)

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation is NEUROLOGIC EDUCATION, TREATMENT, AND RESEARCH FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE II - ADDRESS

The street address and mailing address of the initial principal office of the corporation is 9430 Turkey Lake Road, Suite 218, Orlando, Florida 32819-8014.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- A. Education including educating individuals with neurologic diseases, their family members, and caregivers regarding diagnosis, treatment symptom management, prognosis, wellness and health management.
- B. Treatment providing treatment for individuals with neurologic disorders who have limited or no funding for such treatment.
- Research conducting research in areas affecting quality of life issues primarily for individuals with multiple sclerosis.

b. contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

ARTICLE VIII - DISSOLUTION

Section 1. In the event of dissolution of the corporation, the residual assets of the corporation remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of the corporation, shall be distributed by a majority vote of the Board of Directors to one or more organizations which are exempt as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, exclusively to accomplish public purposes, and none of the assets shall be distributed to any member, director, officer, or trustee of this corporation. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located.

Section 2. In the event this corporation shall become a "private foundation" within the meaning of Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; and shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

ARTICLE IX - BYLAWS

Bylaws to govern the operations of this corporation may be adopted by the incorporator or the Board of Directors. They may be repealed or amended by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV - DIRECTORS

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors. The number of Directors and the method of election or appointment of the directors shall be stated in the bylaws.

ARTICLE V - INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the corporation's initial registered office is 340 North Orange Avenue, Suite E, Orlando, Florida 32801, and the name of the corporation's initial registered agent at that address is Frank J. Pyle, Jr.

ARTICLE VI - INCORPORATOR

The name and address of the incorporator are: Frank J. Pyle, Jr., 340 North Orange Avenue, Suite E, Orlando, Florida 32801

ARTICLE VII - PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- Section I. No dividends shall be paid and no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, directors, trustees, officers, or other private individual, unless they quality for assistance as defined under the Bylaws.
- Section 2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempts to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, or the Bylaws, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation:
- a. exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law),

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENT

This corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provisions contained in these Articles - of Incorporation, or any amendment hereto.
