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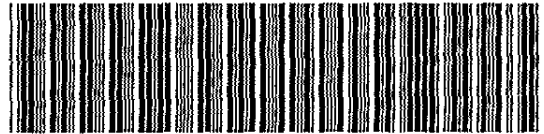

ARTICLE II

Purpose of Caribbean/American Social Awareness Center, Inc.

Caribbean/American Social Awareness Center, Inc. has been organized to operate exclusively for charitable, educational and health care delivery purposes including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Monitoring, assessing and analyzing the status and trends in the global, regional and national aspects of the HIV/AIDS pandemic and responses to it, and publishing and widely disseminating the results of this work in the United States and the Caribbean,
2. Developing and maintaining a membership of concerned individuals in the United States and the Caribbean,
3. Sponsoring, co-sponsoring and participating in workshops, seminars, media campaign, recognition ceremonies and other meetings of its members, and other interested individuals and organizations in order to provide objective timely and high-quality analyses of the most current information on the pandemic,
4. Assessing the development of national programs,
5. Maintaining its independence, while working closely and collaboratively with intergovernmental organizations, regional organizations, governments and non-governmental organizations including foundations, universities, advocacy organizations,
6. Engaging in other activities that are supportive of its purposes and consistent with its status as a charity/non-profit organization, including workshops, seminars, television, radio, media campaign and awards ceremonies.
