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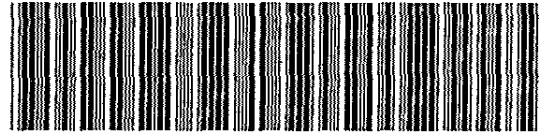

## AMENDED AND ADDED ARTICLES

### ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

To operate as a charitable organization to promote awareness and appreciation of those having their origins in India within the framework of other diverse cultures in this area. It will be accomplished by organizing cultural, educational and charitable activities and soliciting funds to finance them including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. It shall not undertake any activities that are not permitted by the section 501(c)(3).

### ARTICLE IV MANNER OF ELECTION, EARNINGS AND ACTIVITIES

The manner in which the directors are elected or appointed:

The directors are elected from amongst the members of the corporation through the election procedures to be established by the members in due course. No part of the net earnings of corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

### ARTICLE VIII DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such corporation or corporations, as said Court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
