ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of THE REFUGE, A HEALING PLACE, FOUNDATION, INC.

FILED

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ALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, the undersigned Florida nonprofit corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation.

FIRST: Amendments adopted:

ARTICLE III is amended to read:

This Corporation is a not for profit corporation organized under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. It is not organized for the private gains of any person. The purposes for which this Corporation is organized are as follows:

- (a) The specific purpose of this Corporation is to operate exclusively for the advancement of charitable purposes, by the distribution of its funds for such purposes, and particularly for scholarships to those who need extended care for addictions and substance abuse.
- (b) This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- (c) This Corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation; nor shall it participate or intervene (by publication or distribution of any statements or otherwise) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE XIII is added to read:

Upon the dissolution of this Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

SECOND: The date of adoption of the amendments was June 17, 2004. These amendments shall be effective upon filing.

THIRD: Adoption of Amendment: There are no members or members entitled to vote on the amendment. The amendments were adopted by the Board of Directors.
