ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF 04 APR -9 AH 11: 54 Triumph Faith-Based Community Development Center

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation, not for profit, do hereby state the following:

FIRST. The name of said corporation shall be Triumph Faith-Based Community Development Center, Inc.

SECOND. The place in where its principle office is to be located is: 611 13th Avenue East, Bradenton, Manatee County

THIRD. The purpose(s) for which this corporation is formed is:

Said organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the make of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding sections of any future federal tax code.

To provide education and knowledge concerning the prevention of crime, the fear of crime, the problem of illiteracy and the problems of alcohol, tobacco, substance abuse; and health development.

This will be accomplished through:

PROVISIONS OF THE ARTICLES

ARTICLE VII PURPOSE

Said organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the make of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding sections of any future federal tax code.

ARITCLE VIII NONPROFIT CAPITALIZATION

No part of the income of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, officer or director of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or the Corporation in connection with furtherance of it purposes and no member trustee, director of officer of the Corporation or any private person shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the Corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IX MEMBER LIABILITY

The private property of this Corporation's members, director or officers shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever. No director or officer shall be liable for relying in good faith upon the books or account or reports made to the Corporation by any of its officials, members or by an independent accountant selected by the Board of Directors or by any committee so designated by the Corporation, or in relying in good faith upon any other records of the Corporation.

ARTICLE X ACTIVITIES PROHIBITED

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by corporation exempt form Federal income tax under section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding section of any future federal tax code).

ARTICLE XI DISSOLUTION

Upon the time of dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed by the Board of Directors, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all debts, obligations, liabilities, costs and expenses of the corporation, for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
