

Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, this *Florida Not For Profit Corporation* adopts the following amendments to its Articles of Incorporation:

# **AMENDMENTS ADOPTED**

### Article III

The purpose for which this Corporation is formed are exclusively charitable, education, social and cultural and consist of the following:

- A. The specific and primary purposes are:
- 1. To raise the economic, educational and social levels of the residents of Miami-Dade County, who are substantially unemployed, underemployed, to foster and promote community-wide interest and concern for the (a) educational and economic opportunities may be expanded; (b) sickness, poverty, crime, and environmental degradation may be lessened; and (c) racial tensions, prejudice and discrimination, may be eliminated.
- 2. To expand the opportunities available to said residents and groups to develop entrepreneurial and management skills necessary for the successful operation of business enterprises and to assist said residents and groups in obtaining financial support from other sources to own, manage and operate business enterprises in economically depressed areas.
- 3. To expand opportunities available to said residents and groups to obtain adequate decent, safe and sanitary housing in Miami-Dade County. It is the purpose of the corporation thereby to relieve the poor, distressed, underprivileged and indigent by enabling them to secure the basic human needs of decent shelter and to thus lessen the burdens of government and promote the social welfare. To provide such housing through rehabilitation of existing substandard buildings for the purpose of combating the deterioration of the community and contributing to its physical improvement.
- 4. To do any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering, and attaining of the foregoing purposes, either directly or indirectly, with others, such as corporations, firms, associations, trusts, institutions, foundations, or governmental bureaus, departments or agencies.
- B. All of the foregoing purposes and powers shall be exercised exclusively for charitable and educational purposes in such manner that the Corporation shall qualify as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as it is currently and shall hereafter be in force and effect.

## Article VIII

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code 0f 1954 as the same may be amended from time to time.

# Article IX

The Corporation is formed solely for charitable, educational and scientific purposes. The Corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated for the primary purpose of generating pecuniary gain or profit, or dividends to the Directors, Officers, Members thereof, or to any individual, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payment and distribution in furtherance of its specific and primary purposes. The property, assets, profits, and net income of the Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable, educational and scientific purposes.

### Article X

Upon winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the assets of the Corporation remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of the Corporation shall be distributed to an organization recognized as exempt under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Service code and used exclusively to accomplish the primary purposes for which this Corporation is organized. If the Corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such manner as may be directed by decree of the Superior Court of the county in which the Corporation's principal office is located, upon petition by the Attorney General, or by any persons concerned in the liquidation in a proceeding to which the Attorney General is a party.

There are no members and the amendments were adopted by the board of directors.
