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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF TALLAHASSEE FLORIDA

ST. JOSEPH COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT CORPORATION

Pursuant to Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, the following is submitted:

ARTICLE I NAME, DURATION, PRINCIPAL OFFICE & REGISTERED AGENT

- (a) The name of this corporation shall be: ST. JOSEPH COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT CORPORATION (the "Corporation").
- (b) The Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless dissolved sooner according to law.
- (c) The principal office and mailing address of the Corporation will be located at 485. West 1st Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32202, or at such other address as may be determined by the Board of Directors.
- (d) The resident agent of the Corporation is Charles R. Curley, Jr., whose address is 1301 Riverplace Boulevard, Suite 1500, Jacksonville, Florida 32207.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

- (a) This Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes. In pursuance of the foregoing purposes, the Corporation shall seek to improve the quality of life in the community. To accomplish the purpose of the Corporation, the Corporation shall, among other activities, sponsor projects that promote revitalization and empowerment of the community through education, vocational training, planning, housing rehabilitation and construction, and economic, professional and social development.
 - (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation:
 - (1) No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to any director, trustee or officer of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation and payments and distributions may be made in furtherance of one or more of its purposes); and no director, trustee, officer, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distributions of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.
 - (2) No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

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- (3) The Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended or replaced, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code and Regulations as they now exist or they may hereafter be amended or replaced.
- (4) Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
- (5) The Corporation is permitted to make distributions to organizations which qualify as exempt organizations within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding section of any future United States internal revenue law.
- (6) The Corporation is organized pursuant to the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act and does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit and is organized for nonprofit purposes.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

The Corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE IV DIRECTORS

The Corporation shall at all times have at least three (3) members of the Board of Directors. The members of the Board of Directors shall be elected as provided in the Bylaws of the Corporation. Initially, the Board of Directors shall have six (6) members. ARTICLE V AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by the Board of Directors from time to time; and the Articles of Amendment may be signed by an officer of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI BYLAWS

The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall adopt such Bylaws for the conduct of the business of the Corporation in carrying out its purpose as the Board of Directors may deem necessary from time to time; <u>provided</u>, <u>however</u>, such Bylaws shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation. The Board of Directors shall have the power to amend, alter, or rescind the Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION

The Corporation shall indemnify the officers, directors, employees and agents of the Corporation to the full extent permitted by the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. This indemnification provision shall not be deemed to be exclusive of any other rights to which such officers, directors, employees, and agents may be entitled under the Bylaws, any agreement with the Corporation, any insurance maintained by the Corporation, or otherwise.

ARTICLE VIII INCORPORATION
