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ANNUAL REPORT 2005-2006

Brief Description of Agency

The National Council for the Preservation of Black Families (NCPBF) is a voluntary nonprofit membership organization that strives to achieve and maintain a high quality of life for Black families. The NCPBF utilizes advocacy and community-based programming to promote the following:

1. Positive Black family values
2. Effective Black parenting practices
3. Functional Black family relationships
4. Home environments for Black children that yield positive emotional, intellectual, spiritual, and physical child development
5. Development of community supports to assist Black families in need
6. Preservation of focus on Black families as the fabric of Black communities

Projects and Activities

1. National Centers for Black Families

- Mother-Daughter Bonding Centers – community-based programming that promotes good health, self-awareness, spirituality, personal freedom, physical/psychological fulfillment, self-confidence, and close bonds between young girls and positive women role models.
- A.D.A.M. (Awesome Dads, Awesome Men) Centers for Black Fathers – community-based parenting education and support programming for fathers and fathers-to-be in an effort to assist fathers to take a positive role in their baby's life
- Center for Positive Black Child Development – community-based programming to address diverse needs of Black children. Will partner with Black community based human services organizations around the nation to develop, support, and implement high quality programs for Black children.
- Centers for Research, Public Policy, and Training on Black Family Life – will gather, initiate and disseminate information to enhance public knowledge of challenges Black families face and effective strategies to improve the quality of life for Black families. Will publish newsletters (print and online), magazines, research articles, curriculums, and other scholarly documents. Will maintain an effective political presence to ensure development of public policy that is supportive of Black family needs.

Summary of Activities in 2005-2006

The NCPBF was established during the 2004-2005 fiscal year. To date, we have developed our agency's local, state, and national focus (see agency description above). We have been working on developing its corporate infrastructure. We are in the process of establishing an Executive Board and assigned officers. We are developing by-laws, an organizational chart, and a plan to launch our service and advocacy initiatives. We expect that these tasks will be completed towards the end of the fiscal year, and we will be able to move to the next phase of our organization's development in the beginning of the next fiscal year.
