

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

<u>of</u>

THE INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION FOR GREEK LANGUAGE AND CULTURE, INC.

(A Corporation Not for Profit)

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, all being of full age, do hereby associate ourselves together and do hereby agree for ourselves, our associates and our assigns, to become a corporation, not for profit, under Chapter 617, *Florida Statutes*, providing for the formation, liability, rights, privileges, benefits and obligations conferred upon and imposed by law on corporations organized pursuant to the provisions thereof; and hereby make, subscribe, acknowledge and file these Articles of Incorporation as follows:

ARTICLE I

NAME OF CORPORATION

1.01 Name – The name of this corporation shall be The International Foundation for Greek Language and Culture, Inc.

ARTICLE II

GENERAL NATURE OF BUSINESS

2.01 The American Foundation of Greek Language and Culture, Inc., a not-forprofit educational corporation organized and incorporated in the State of Florida

- (N48864), becomes a division of The International Foundation For Greek Language and Culture, Inc.
- 2.02 <u>Purposes</u> The goals, objectives and purposes for which this corporation is formed are similar to those of The American Foundation for Greek Language and Culture. That is, the mission of The International Foundation for Greek Language and Culture, Inc., a corporation not for profit organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida (Charter Number , Employer Identification Number) is to engage in assisting the establishment of educational programs at academic institutions to promote the language, history and culture of Greece. More specifically, the aim and objective of the Corporation is to raise funds to achieve its goals, which are:
 - a. To assist in establishing and enhancing the offering of studies in the Greek language and related fields of literature, history, philosophy, art, society and culture at academic institutions. Thus:
 - a.1---To assist in the establishment of curriculum in the Greek language and related fields, especially literature, leading to baccalaureate degrees; and
 - a.2---To encourage and assist academic institutions in establishing graduate programs in the aforementioned areas of Greek studies;
 - b. To work with other organizations in the United States and elsewhere whose goals and objectives are to promote and enhance the teaching of Greek language, literature and culture at academic institutions;

- To assist academic institutions in the collection of research materials and manuscripts pertaining to Greek culture and Greek studies in general;
- d. To assist in the creation of archives of Greek-American families and organizations that have contributed to shaping the history of America;
- e. To assist in establishing and organizing:
 - a.1---Visiting lecture programs of prominent scholars in Greek culture and studies; and
 - a.2—Exchange programs of prominent scholars in Greek studies between academic institutions in Greece and the United States and elsewhere:
- f. To organize seminars, symposia and conferences to promote the aims and objectives of the foundation;
- g. To assist in the publishing of scholarly works in Greek studies in any and all of the aforementioned fields of research pertaining to Greek culture;
- h. To engage from time to time in other matters relating to Greek cultural studies and education in areas such as research projects on the Greek language or history and society of Greece, as the Trustees shall deem appropriate.
- 2.03 Assets The assets of the Corporation shall be expended exclusively for the above purposes. Grants may not be made to any organization for these purposes other than established institutions of higher learning; but research grants may be made to individuals under the supervision of the foundation or academic institutions consistent with the aims and objectives of the foundation in such amounts as the Board of Trustees of this Corporation may determine.

- 2.04 <u>Powers</u> The Corporation shall have all powers conferred upon corporations not for profit organized under Chapter 617 of <u>Florida Statutes</u> and any successor provisions thereto now enacted or hereafter amended, but shall exercise such provisions in fulfillment of its above-stated purpose. It shall not engage in any of the following activities:
 - a. The Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office;
 - No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation;
 - c. No dividends shall be paid and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall accrue to the benefit of any individual.

ARTICLE III

SCOPE OF POWERS

3.01 The Corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, desirable, suitable or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of all or any of the purposes for which the Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations, whose activities are such as to further accomplish, foster or attain any of such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Corporation shall exercise only such powers as are set forth in furtherance of the exempt purpose of organizations specified in

Section 501c(3) of the <u>Internal Revenue Code of 1954</u>, as amended, and its regulations as the same may now exist or as they may hereafter be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE IV

NON-PROFIT CHARACTER OF THE CORPORATION

4.01 Organization - This Corporation is not organized for profit and no part of the earnings of the Corporation shall accrue to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. In the event of the liquidation or dissolution of the Corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, no member shall be entitled to any distribution or division of its remaining property or proceeds; and the balance of all monies and other properties received by the Corporation from any source, after payment of all debts and obligations, shall be distributed subject to the order of the Circuit Court of the State of Florida, as provided in *F.S.* S617.05, exclusively for purposes within those set forth in Article II of these Articles of Incorporation, and within the intention of S501c(3) of the *Internal Revenue Code of 1954* and the regulations as they may be amended.

ARTICLE V

OUALIFICATION

5.01 <u>Members</u> — The membership of this Corporation shall consist of all persons hereinafter named as Trustees and such other persons as from time to time hereafter may become members in the manner provided in the by-laws.

ARTICLE VI

TERM OF EXISTENCE

6.01 This Corporation is to exist perpetually, or until dissolved by operation of law.

ARTICLE VII

INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

- 7.01 <u>Initial Registered Office</u> The address of the initial Registered Office of the Corporation in the State of Florida is 1202 Parrilla de Avila, Tampa, and the initial Registered Agent is Chris P. Tsokos.
- 7.02 <u>Relocation</u> The Board of Trustees may from time to time move the location of the Registered Office to any other address in Florida, and may from time to time change the Registered Agent of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

OFFICERS

8.01 The officers of this Corporation shall be the **President**, **Vice-president**, **Secretary**, and **Treasurer**, and such other officers as shall be provided in the By-Laws of the Corporation, except that the President may not also be the Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Corporation. 
