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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF Options of Pinellas, Inc.

The undersigned, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Not for Profit LORIDA Corporation Act of the State of Florida, adopt the following articles of incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation, referred to as the "Options of Pinellas, Inc.".

ARTICLE II Place of Business

Until the Board of Directors appoint a new location the principal office of "Options of Pinellas, Inc." will be at 1532 San Mateo Dr; Dunedin, Fla 34698.

ARTICLE III Purposes

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, and or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and to that end, the Corporation is empowered to hold any property, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value; to dispose of any such property and to invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal or the income in such manner as, in the judgment of the directors, will best promote the purposes of the Corporation, without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, these Articles of Incorporation, the By-Laws of the Corporation, or any applicable laws, to do any other act or thing incidental to or connected with the foregoing purposes or in advancement thereof, but not for the pecuniary profit or financial gain of its directors or officers except as permitted under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.

ARTICLE IV

At all times the following shall operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the corporation:

- 1. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to any member of the corporation not qualifying as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, nor to any Director or officer of the corporation, nor to any other private persons, excepting solely such reasonable compensation that the corporation shall pay for services actually rendered to the corporation, or allowed by the corporation as a reasonable allowance for authorized expenditures incurred on behalf of the corporation;
- 2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall constitute the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, or any initiative or referendum before the public, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including by publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on

behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office; and

- Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended.
- 4. The corporation shall not lend any of its assets to any officer or director of this corporation [unless such loan program is regularly conducted as part of the activities of the organization and the qualification of the individual to participate in same is determined by a panel comprised solely of non-Board members], or guarantee to any person the payment of a loan by an officer or director of this corporation.

ARTICLE V Members

Section 1. Membership. A natural person may become a member of the corporation by completing the following: (1) paying the annual membership fee and (2) completing an application form.

Section 2. Voting Rights. Each member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members.

Section 3. Annual Meeting: The annual meeting of the members shall be held on the second Tuesday of March in each year, beginning at 7:00 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of electing directors and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting. If the day fixed for the annual meeting shall be legal holiday in Florida, such meeting shall be a held on the next succeeding business day. If the election of directors is not held on that day, the board of directors shall call a special meeting of the members as soon thereafter as is convenient. The meeting shall be held at the registered office, unless some other place is specified in the annual meeting notice. It shall be held in the city of Dunedin, State of Florida. Section 4. Rules. Meetings of members shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (1990).

Article V **Initial Board of Directors**

The following will act as the Board of Directors until the first membership meeting on March 8, 2005. At which time seven Board of Directors will be appointed.
