ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

VISION OF HARVEST COMMUNITY OUTREACH & DEVELOPMENT CORP, INC.

THE UNDERSIGNED, as incorporator and on behalf of a not-for-profit, non-stock corporation under the laws' of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I NAME

<u>Section 1.1</u>. The name of this Corporation is <u>Vision Of Harvest Community</u> <u>Outreach & Community Development Corporation, Inc.</u> (the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II DURATION

<u>Section 2.1.</u> The Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless dissolved pursuant to law.

ARTICLE III NON-STOCK CORPORATION

Section 3.1. The Corporation shall be organized on a non-stock basis under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act and may Issue Certificates of Membership

ARTICLE: IV PURPOSE

Section 4.1 The purpose for which the Corporation is organized Is for transacting any and all lawful business for which corporations may be Incorporated under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act and to distribute the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes, either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto, as they now exist or as they may

hereafter be amended. To which end the corporation is specifically authorized to conduct, perform, and undertake any of the following activities:

Cultural Arts

- a. To promote interests in the visual and fine arts and crafts, crafts, the performing arts, the literary arts, video production and other cultural activities.
- b. To provide a location and focus for the creation, preparation, and presentation of cultural activities, programs, and works in the State of Florida and particularly in Broward County, Florida.
- c. To lease or purchase, develop or redevelop real estate to provide theater, studio, gallery, library, classroom, and other cultural space, facilities, and infrastructure.
- d. To produce and present, independently or in concert with other institutions or individuals: musical, theatrical, or dance performances; art shows; literary readings or workshops; and other events of a cultural nature.
- e. To stimulate public interest in and provide public recognition for the works of local and regional artists, writers, and others enhancing the cultural life of the community.
- f. To provide a bridge between the governmental sector, the business sector, the non-profit sector, and the community at large, in enhancing awareness and support for cultural activities and enhancing the quality of life in Florida, and particularly in Broward County, Florida.

Community Development

Without expanding the foregoing, the Corporation's purpose also includes to: provide decent housing to low and moderate income people residing principally in <u>Broward County</u>, <u>Florida</u>; undertake community economic revitalization activities to combat community deterioration; undertake community development and community self-help activities to assist low-income individuals and families achieve self-sufficiency; and provide other activities and services that are necessary or appropriate to carry out.

Childcare Center

The Corporation's purpose also includes to: provide childcare to low and moderate income people residing principally in <u>Broward County</u>, <u>Florida</u>;

undertake community development and community self-help activities to assist low-income individuals and families achieve self-sufficiency; and provide other activities and services that are necessary or appropriate to carry out.

Soup Kitchen

The Corporation's purpose will also include to: provide food, shelter, clothing, and gift baskets for Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving to the needy and assist low-income individuals and families achieve self-sufficiency; and provide other activities and services that are necessary or appropriate to carry out.

Section 4.2. The Corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage In any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which a Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further accomplish, foster or attain any such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Corporation shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Section 501 (c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the regulations thereunder as the same now exist or as they may be hereinafter amended from time to time.

<u>Section 4.3</u>. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, of be distributed to, any Director or Officer of the Corporation or any other private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation affection one or more of Its purposes); and no Director or Officer of the Corporation or any other private Individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.

<u>Section 4.4</u>. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall he the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

- <u>Section 4.5</u>. The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- <u>Section 4.6</u>. The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined In Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- Section 4.7. The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined In Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- <u>Section 4.8</u>. The Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- <u>Section 4.9</u>. The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined In Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- Section 4.10. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organiza₁tion exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) Internal Revenue Code and said Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- Section 4.11. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation, exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such 'manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes, as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United Stated Internal Revenue

Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the court having proper jurisdiction in the county where the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE V MEMBERS

<u>Section 5.1</u>. This Corporation shall have a membership consisting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation serving from time to time.

ARTICLE VI DIRECTORS

- Section 6.1. The affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), subject to the restriction that, except as specifically set forth to the contrary in the Bylaws, the exercise of any powers or actions of the Board shall require the approval thereof by a majority vote of the Board present at a meeting at which a quorum of no less than two (2) Directors are present. The affirmative vote of at two (2) Directors shall be necessary for all corporate action requiring a vote of the Board, including, but not limited to the following:
- 6.1.1 Approval of charitable gifts, transfers, distributions and grants by the Corporation to other entities.
- 6.1.2. Adoption of an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws.
- 6.1.3. Organization of a subsidiary or affiliate by the Corporation.
- 6.1.4 Approval of any merger, consolidation or sale or other transfer of all Dr a substantial part of the assets of the Corporation.
- Section 6.2. The Initial Board of Directors shall consist of the following members elected in accordance with this Section 6.2 and the Bylaws:
