

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

THE PEPPER TREE MAGAZINE, INC.

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The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a not for profit corporation under Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the corporation ("Corporation") is: The Pepper Tree Magazine, Inc.

ARTICLE II - PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The street address of the principal office of the Corporation is P.O. Box 15950, Sarasota, Florida 34241.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSES

The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes, including, but not limited to:

- 1. Publish and distribute an educational literary and artistic publication comprised of articles authored by writers of all ages and illustrations created by members of the Corporation's local community. Neither the writers nor the artists receive compensation for their submissions to the publication. The publication is distributed free of charge to the general public and to educational institutions for use in classrooms all as permitted under the laws of the United States and the State of Florida.
- 2. Conducting its affairs, carrying on its operations, and having offices and exercising powers granted by the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act in any state or in any foreign country.
 - Administering for charitable purposes property donated to the Corporation..
- 4. Distributing property for such purposes in accordance with the terms of gifts, bequests or devises to the Corporation not inconsistent with its purposes, as set forth in these Articles of Incorporation, or in accordance with the determination made by the Board of Directors pursuant to these Articles of Incorporation.

- 5. Receiving gifts and bequests and to use the principal and income generated from the investment of the gifts and bequests for the benefit of the Corporation, or such other charitable, religious or educational organizations that are described in §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), and exempt from taxation under § 501(a) of the Code.
- 6. Reserving the power to modify any restriction or condition on the distribution of funds for any specified charitable purposes or to specified organizations if in the sole judgment of the Board of Directors (without the necessity of the approval of any trustee, custodian or agent), such restriction or condition becomes, in effect, unnecessary, incapable of fulfillment, or inconsistent with the charitable need.
- 7. Engaging in any and all lawful activities necessary or desirable for the accomplishment of any of the above-described powers.

<u>ARTICLE IV - ELECTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS</u>

The Method for electing the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be stated in the bylaws of the Corporation.

ARTICLE V - INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT AND ADDRESS

The initial street address of the Corporation's registered office is lcard, Merrill, Cullis, Timm, Furen & Ginsburg, P.A., 2033 Main Street, Suite 600, Sarasota, FL 34237. The initial registered agent for the Corporation at that address is Katherine L. Smith, Esq.

ARTICLE VI - DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation by distributing those assets exclusively for charitable purposes in such manner or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable or scientific purposes as shall, at the time, qualify as exempt under §501(c)(3) of the Code, as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the circuit court which has general jurisdiction for the county in which the principal office of the Corporation shall then be located exclusively for such charitable purposes or such charitable organization or organizations described in §501(c)(3) of the Code as the court shall select.
