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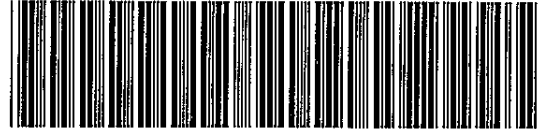

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
Advocates for Children and Elders International
Florida, Inc.

A Florida "Not for Profit" Corporation

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a corporation under Chapter 617 of Florida Statutes, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I - THE CORPORATION

SECTION 1. The name of the corporation is **Advocates for Children and Elders International - Florida, Inc.**, with ACE as an acronym that means Advocates for Children and Elders.

SECTION 2. The principal office of the corporation is located at 659 NE 125 Street, North Miami, FL 33161.

SECTION 3. The mailing address of the corporation is 659 NE 125 Street, North Miami, FL 33161.

SECTION 4. The corporation is a private not for profit entity, with the intent of also becoming tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, subject to public auditing and accountability.

4A. The purposes for which **Advocated for Children and Elders International - Florida, Inc.** is organized are exclusively charitable within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

4B. Notwithstanding any provisions of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

SECTION 5. The existence of this Corporation shall commence upon the filing of its Articles of Incorporation by the Florida Department of State and shall continue in perpetuity.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSES

SECTION 1. The purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

- A. To protect the human rights and improve the lives of disadvantaged children and elders in the Philippines.
- B. To do any and all lawful activities for the furtherance and accomplishment of the above-mentioned purpose, either directly or indirectly, and either alone or in cooperation with others that share the same mission.

SECTION 2. The corporation is not organized nor shall it be operated for the primary purpose of

generating pecuniary gain or profit.

SECTION 3. All of the foregoing purposes and powers shall be exercised exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes in such manner that the corporation shall qualify as an exempt organization under section 501 (c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code.

SECTION 4. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be undertaken to participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERS AND OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Members of the corporation shall be made up of individuals of legal age, interested in protecting the human rights and improving the lives of disadvantaged children and elders in the Philippines.

SECTION 2. The Executive Officers of the corporation shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, duly appointed by the Board of Directors. The names, addresses and positions of initial officers and directors are:

ARTICLE IV – MEETINGS

SECTION 1. An annual Board of Directors and general membership meeting shall be held at least once a year, at the beginning of each fiscal year, at a time and place agreed upon by the Board of Directors, for the following purposes:

- a. To receive the President's Annual Report
- b. To receive the Treasurer's Financial Report
- c. To discuss and review programs and projects
- d. To elect officers

SECTION 2. Notice of the annual meeting shall be sent by the Secretary or President to officers and members of the corporation at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of the said meeting by phone, e-mail, regular mail or fax. At the annual meeting, the quorum shall be a majority of the executive and board membership.

SECTION 3. Additional meetings of the Board of Directors may be had by means of a telephone conference, web conference, electronic or similar communications equipment by which participation of all persons under such circumstances shall constitute presence at the meeting. Such conference may be electronically recorded and incorporated into the minutes.

SECTION 4. Communication by, for, and with the members, officers or directors may be transmitted by electronic mail through the Corporate listserve, moderated, and correspondingly incorporated in the official files of the Corporation. Personal comments unrelated to the official business of the Corporation will be deleted.

ARTICLE V – FINANCES

SECTION 1. The corporation's fiscal or financial year shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31 of the same year.

SECTION 2. Except as otherwise provided by law, checks, drafts, and orders for the payment of money of this corporation shall be signed by the President or at least two persons previously designated by a resolution of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 3. The Corporation shall raise funds through grants and public support, and may engage in other income-generating activities within the provisions specified under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to accomplish its mission.

SECTION 4. All funds raised and disbursed by the corporation shall be fully accountable and all records shall be open to the public.

SECTION 5. Trust accounts set up by the corporation for grants, donations, requests, and other gifts or funding assigned to specific projects may be subject to restrictions, provided that such restrictions on the use of the trust account do not conflict with the other policies of ACE International-Florida, Inc., or with federal, state or local laws.

SECTION 6. No part of the corporation's earnings may inure to the benefit of any member, founder, director, contributor or private individuals. The corporation shall not distribute any gains, profits or dividends to the Directors, Officers, or Members thereof, or to any individual, except as reasonable compensation for services actually performed in carrying out the corporation's charitable and educational purposes. The property, assets, profits and net income of the corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes no part of which shall inure to the benefit of any individual.

SECTION 7. The corporation prohibits any conflict of interest or the appearance of conflict of interest by board members, officers, employees, consultants and relatives.

SECTION 8. The corporation's accounting and internal control systems shall follow Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and assure that an annual independent financial audit is performed in accordance with Federal audit requirements.

SECTION 9. In the event of dissolution, all money and residual assets remaining after all financial obligations and trust accounts have been cleared shall be turned over to one or more organizations that are themselves exempt as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding sections of any prior or future law, or the Federal, State or local government for exclusive public purpose. The recipient organization or charitable institution shall be selected by at least three-fourths (3/4) of all existing members of the Governing Board.

ARTICLE VI. INDEMNIFICATION

Any person (and the heirs, executors and administrators of such person) made or threatened to be made a party to any action, suit or proceeding by reason of the fact that he is or was a Director or Officer of the corporation shall be indemnified by the corporation against any and all liability and the reasonable expenses, including attorney's fees and disbursements, incurred by him (or by his heirs, executors or administrators) in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, suit or proceeding, or in connection with any appearance therein, except in relation to matters as to which it shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding that such Director or Officer is liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duties. Such right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such Director or Officer (or such heirs, executors or administrators) may be entitled apart from this Article.

ARTICLE VII – AMENDMENTS AND IMPLEMENTATION

SECTION 1 The affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by its Constitution and By-laws which may be reviewed and amended upon approval by a two-thirds vote at a Board of Directors' meeting that is especially called for that purpose.




