Articles of Incorporation of the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes Chapter 617, makes, adopts and hereby certify the following:

ARTICLE 1. Name. The name of the corporation shall be <u>HISPANIC Y OUNG PROFESSIONALS AND ENTREPRENEURS</u>, INC.

ARTICLE 2. Address. The place in this state where the principal office of the Corporation is to be located is the 101 E. KENNEDY BLVD, SUITE 3170, TAMPA, FLORIDA 33602, Hillsborough County. The address of the principal office and the mailing address of the corporation is: 101 E. KENNEDY BLVD, SUITE 3170, TAMPA, FLORIDA 33602, Hillsborough County

ARTICLE 3. Initial Registered Office and Agent. The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is: 101 E. Kennedy Blvd. Suite 3170, Tampa, Florida 33602. The name of its initial registered agent at that address is: Gilberto E. Sanchez, Esq.

<u>ARTICLE 4</u>. Members. The corporation may have members as set forth in the Bylaws, but shall not issue membership certificates. The corporation shall not issue shares of stock.

ARTICLE 5. Not for Profit. The corporation is a not for profit corporation under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. The corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of its directors or officers, except to the extent permissible under these articles, under law and under 26 U.S.C.A. § 501(c)(3) (referred to below as "code"). If the corporation ever has members, no member shall have any vested right, interest or privilege in or to the assets, income or property of the corporation and no part of the income or assets of the corporation shall be distributable to or for the benefit of its members, except to the extent permissible under these Articles, under law and under 26 U.S.C.A. § 501(c)(3).

ARTICLE 6: Duration. The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE 7. Purposes. The corporation is organized, and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes, including but not limited to making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

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sponsoring, organizing, administering, enhancing, and/or operating art and cultural exhibitions, assemblies, special events, programming and/or activities that benefit the public.

ARTICLE 8. Powers. Solely for the above purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:

- A. Arrange for, sponsor, co-sponsor, organize, promote, enhance or operate the exchange of Latin heritage, culture and goodwill that benefits the public.
- B. To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida on nonprofit corporations, including but not limited to those set forth in Florida Statutes Chapter 617 and the following powers: to acquire by bequest, devise, gift, grant, donation, contribution, purchase, lease or otherwise any property of any sort or nature without limitation as to its amount or value, and to hold, invest, reinvest, manage, use, apply, employ, sell, expend, disburse, lease, mortgage, convey, option, donate or otherwise dispose of the property and the income, principal and proceeds of the property.
- C. To engage in and transact any other lawful activity, solely in furtherance of the above purposes, for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, and any successor or amendment to the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act.
- D. To do any other things as are incidental to the powers of the corporation or necessary or desirable in order to accomplish the purposes of the corporation.

ARTICLE 9. Limitation. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and contributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Seven hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the

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Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section

170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE 10. Tax Exempt Status. It is intended that the corporation shall have and continue to have the status of a corporation that is exempt from federal income taxation 26 U.S.C.A. § 501(a) as an organization described in 26 U.S.C.A. § 501(c)(3) and which is other than a private foundation as defined in 26 U.S.C.A. § 509. These articles shall be construed accordingly, and all powers and activities of the corporation shall be limited accordingly. The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation to such an extent as would result in the loss of exemption under 26 U.S.C.A. § 501(c)(3). All references in these articles to sections of the Internal Revenue Code shall be considered references to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as from time to time amended, and to the corresponding provisions of any similar law subsequently enacted.

ARTICLE 11. Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE 12. Board of Directors and Officers. There shall be a board of directors consisting of at least eight individuals. The name, addresses and title of the board of directors are as followed:

ARTICLE 13. Officers. The officers of the corporation may consist of Co-Chairs, president, one or more vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer, and any other officers and assistant officers as may be provided for in the bylaws or by resolution of the board of directors. Each officer shall be elected by majority vote of the board of directors (and may be removed by majority vote of the board of directors) at such a time and in such a manner as may be prescribed by the bylaws or by law.

ARTICLE 14. Incorporators. The name and street address of incorporator is Gilberto E. Sanchez Esq., address: 101 E. Kennedy Blvd., Suite 3170, Tampa, FL 33602.

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ARTICLE 15. Bylaws. The bylaws of the corporation are to be made and adopted by the board of directors, and may be altered, amended or rescinded by the board of directors.

ARTICLE 16. Amendment. The corporation reserves the right to amend or repeal any provision contained in these articles of incorporation or any amendment to them.

ARTICLE 17. Indemnification and Civil Liability Immunity. The corporation shall indemnify each director and officer, including former directors and officers, to the fullest extent allowed by law, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 617. It is intended that the corporation be an organization the officers and directors of which are immune from civil liability to the extent provided under Florida Statutes Chapter 617 and other similar laws.

ARTICLE 18. Commencement of Corporate Existence. The date when corporate existence shall commence is February 1st 2006.
