ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OLDSMAR CHRISTIAN CENTER PRAISE & WORSHIP FELLOWSHIP CHURCH, INC. (Florida Non-Profit Corporation)

THE UNDERSIGNED, each with the capacity to contract, hereby executes and acknowledges these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit and by virtue of the laws of the state of Florida. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY ADOPTS THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of this corporation shall be OLDSMAR CHRISTIAN CENTER PRAISE & WORSHIP FELLOWSHIP CHURCH, INC. The physical address of the corporation is 1170 COURT STREET CLEARWATER, FLORIDA 33756. The mailing address of the corporation is P. O. BOX 202 OLDSMAR, FLORIDA 34677.

ARTICLE 2. PURPOSE

The specific purpose for which the corporation is initially organized is to ESTABLISH AND OVERSEE PLACES OF WORSHIP, CONDUCT THE WORK OF EVANGELISM WORLDWIDE, CREATE DEPARTMENTS NECESSARY TO SUPPORT MISSIONARY ACTIVITIES AND TO LICENSE AND OVERSEE MINISTERS OF THE GOSPEL and to also engage in activities which are necessary, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of that purpose, or which are incidental thereto or connected therewith which are consistent with Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious purpose within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3), Internal revenue Code.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation will not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by (i) a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law, or (ii) a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any other corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any other corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law. The members or covenant fellowship partners of the corporation shall consist of any person accepted by the Elders board of directors expressing a desire to help further the purpose for which the corporation was organized, and who displays a willingness to regularly contribute time and service for this regard. A mature person, of noble character, and good reputation within the community, who is willing to contribute time and money for these purpose may, upon request, be admitted to membership by vote of majority of the Elders board of directors.

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ARTICLE 4. TERM

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The date of commencement of corporate existences shall be when these articles have been filed with the Department of State and approved by it and the respective filing fee has been paid; the term for which the corporation is to exist shall be perpetual. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code. In the event of dissolution of the corporation, no part of the corporation's earnings or assets shall inure to the benefit of any of its members; the residual assets of the corporation shall be distributed to one or more organizations which themselves are exempt as organizations described in Section 501 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1968, or corresponding sections of any prior or future law, or to the federal, state or local government for exclusive public purpose.

ARTICLE 5. NON PROFIT ORGANIZATION

No part of the net earning of the corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in article 2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE 8. DIRECTORS

The board of directors of the corporation shall consist of no less than (3) directors as determined by the bylaws. Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members in the manner provided by the bylaws. Directors may be removed and the vacancies shall be filled in the manner provided by the bylaws. the directors named in these articles shall serve as directors for the ensuing year, or until the first annual meeting of the corporation, and any vacancies before then shall be filled in the manner set forth in the bylaws. the board of directors shall have the authority to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as directors and to fix the basis and conditions upon which this compensation shall be paid. Any director may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation there from in any form. The directors whose positions and duties are set forth in the bylaws will manage the affairs of this corporation.
