

#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

### **FOR**

# THE BUSINESS ARTS BUILDING, INC. A Condominium Association

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the state of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

# ARTICLE 1 NAME AND ADDRESS

The name of the corporation shall be THE BUSINESS ARTS BUILDING, INC. The principal address of the corporation is c/o 13961 Spoonbill St. N, Jacksonville, FL 32224. For convenience, the corporation shall be referred to in this instrument as the "Association," the Declaration of Condominium as the "Declaration," these Articles of Incorporation as the "Articles," and the Bylaws of the Association as the "Bylaws."

## ARTICLE 2 PURPOSE

The purpose for which the Association is organized is to provide an entity under the Florida Condominium Act as it exists on the date hereof (the "Act") for the operation of that certain condominium located or to be located in Duval County, Florida, and known as The Business Arts Building at Harbour Village.

## ARTICLE 3 DEFINITIONS

The terms used in these Articles shall have the same definitions and meanings as those set forth in the Declaration to be recorded in the Public Records of Duval County, Florida, unless herein provided to the contrary or unless the context otherwise requires.

## ARTICLE 4 POWERS

The powers of the Association shall include and be governed by the following:

4.1 General. The Association shall have all of the common-law and statutory powers of a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of Florida that are not in conflict with the provisions of these Articles, the Declaration, the Bylaws, or the Act.

- 4.2 Enumeration. The Association shall have the powers and duties set forth in the Act except as limited by these Articles, the Bylaws, and the Declaration (to the extent that they are not in conflict with the Act) and all of the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Condominium under the Declaration and as more particularly described in the Bylaws, as they may be amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, the following:
  - (a) To make and collect assessments and other charges against members as Unit Owners, and to use the proceeds thereof in the exercise of its powers and duties;
  - (b) To buy, own, operate, lease, sell, trade, and mortgage both real and personal property;
  - (c) To maintain, repair, replace, reconstruct, add to, and operate the Condominium Property, and other property acquired or leased by the Association;
  - (d) To purchase insurance upon the Condominium Property and insurance for the protection of the Association, its Officers, Directors, and Unit Owners;
  - (e) To make and amend reasonable rules and regulations for the maintenance, conservation, and use of the Condominium Property and for the health, comfort, safety, and welfare of the Unit Owners;
  - (f) To approve or disapprove the leasing, transfer of ownership, and occupancy to the extent authorized by the Declaration and the Bylaws;
  - (g) To enforce by legal means the provisions of the Act, the Declaration, these Articles, the Bylaws, and the Rules and Regulations for the use of the Condominium Property, subject, however, to the limitation regarding assessing Units owned by the Developer for fees and expenses relating in any way to claims or potential claims against the Developer;
  - (h) To contract for the management and maintenance of the Condominium Property and to authorize a management agent (which may be an affiliate of the Developer) to assist the Association in carrying out its powers and duties by performing such functions as the submission of proposals, collection of assessments, preparation of records, enforcement of rules, and maintenance, repair and replacement of the Common Elements using funds made available by the Association. The Association and its Officers shall, however, retain at all times the powers and duties granted by the Act, including, but not limited to, the levy of assessments, promulgation of rules, and execution of contracts on behalf of the Association; and
  - (i) To employ personnel to perform the services required for the proper operation, maintenance, conservation, and use of the Condominium.
- 4.3 Condominium Property. All funds and the title to all properties acquired by the Association and their proceeds shall be held for the benefit and use of the members in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration, these Articles, and the Bylaws.

- 4.4 Distribution of Income; Dissolution. The Association shall make no distributions of income to its members, Directors or Officers.
- 4.5 Limitation. The powers of the Association shall be subject to and shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions hereof and of the Declaration, the Bylaws and the Act, provided that in the event of conflict, the provisions of the Act shall control over those of the Declaration and Bylaws.

# ARTICLE 5 MEMBERS

- 5.1 Membership. The members of the Association shall consist of all of the record title Owners of Units in the Condominium from time to time, and, after termination of the Condominium, shall also consist of those who were members at the time of such termination, and their successors and assigns. New members shall deliver a true copy of the recorded deed or other instrument of acquisition of title.
- Assignment. The share of a member in the funds and assets of the Association cannot be assigned, hypothecated, or transferred in any manner except as an appurtenance to the Unit for which that share is held.
- Voting. On all matters upon which the membership shall be entitled to vote, there shall be only one vote for each Unit, which vote shall be exercised or cast in the manner provided by the Declaration and Bylaws. Any person or entity owning more than one Unit shall be entitled to one vote for each Unit owned.
- 5.4 Meetings. The Bylaws shall provide for an annual meeting of members, and may provide for regular and special meetings of members other than the annual meeting.

# ARTICLE 6 TERM OF EXISTENCE

The Association shall exist perpetually.

## ARTICLE 7 INCORPORATOR

The name and address of the Incorporator of this Corporation is The Structure Companies, LLC, whose address is 13961 Spoonbill Street N, Jacksonville, FL 32224.

# ARTICLE 8 OFFICERS

The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the Officers holding the offices designated in the Bylaws. The Officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Association at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the members of the Association and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The Bylaws may provide for the removal from office of Officers, for filling vacancies, and for the duties and qualifications of the Officers. The names and addresses of the Directors and Officers who shall serve until successors are designated by the Board of Directors and the members, are as follows:

# ARTICLE 9 DIRECTORS

- 9.1 Number and Qualification. The property, business, and affairs of the Association shall be managed by a board consisting of the number of Directors determined in the manner provided by the Bylaws, but which shall consist of not less than three (3) Directors and which shall always be an odd number.
- 9.2 Duties and Powers. All of the duties and powers of the Association existing under the Act, the Declaration, these Articles, and the Bylaws shall be exercised exclusively by the Board of Directors, its agents, contractors, or employees, subject only to approval by Unit Owners when such approval is specifically required.
- 9.3 Election; Removal. Directors of the Association shall be appointed first by the Developer and thereafter elected at the annual meeting of the members in the manner determined by and subject to the qualifications set forth in the Declaration and the Bylaws. Directors may be removed and vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the Bylaws.
- 9.4 Term of Developer's Directors. The Developer of the Condominium shall appoint the members of the first Board of Directors and their replacements who shall hold office for the periods described in the Bylaws.
- 9.5 First Directors. The names and addresses of the members of the first Board of Directors who shall hold office until their successors are elected and have taken office, as provided in the Bylaws, are as follows:

# ARTICLE 10 INDEMNIFICATION

- 10.1 Indemnity. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or contemplated action, lawsuit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, by reason of the fact that individual is or was a Director, employee, Officer, or agent of the Association, against expenses (including the fees of attorneys and paralegal and such fees incurred before, during and after trial, on appeal and in bankruptcy), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by that person in connection with such action, lawsuit, or proceeding unless: (a) a court of competent jurisdiction determines, after all available appeals have been exhausted or not pursued by the proposed indemnitee, that said individual did not act in good faith or in a manner that such individual reasonably believed to be not in, or opposed to, the best interest of the Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that such individual had reasonable cause to believe their conduct was unlawful, and (b) such court further specifically determines that indemnification should be denied. The termination of any action, lawsuit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the individual did not act in good faith or did act in a manner that reasonably believed to be not in, or opposed to, the best interest of the Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that said individual had reasonable cause to believe that their conduct was unlawful.
- 10.2 Expenses. To the extent that a Director, Officer, employee, or agent of the Association is successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, lawsuit, or proceeding referred to in Section 10.1 above, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, such individual shall be indemnified against expenses (including the fees of attorneys and paralegal and such fees incurred before, during and after trial, on appeal and in bankruptcy) actually and reasonably incurred in connection with that defense.
- 10.3 Advances. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, lawsuit, or proceeding shall not be paid by the Association in advance of the final disposition of such action, lawsuit, or proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the affected Director, Officer, employee, or agent to repay such amount, unless it shall be determined ultimately that such individual will be entitled to be indemnified by the Association as authorized in this Article 10.
- 10.4 Miscellaneous. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, vote of members, or otherwise, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Director, Officer, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs and personal representatives of that person.

- Insurance. The Association shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Director, Officer, employee, or agent of the Association, or is or was serving, at the request of the Association, as a Director, Officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against and incurred by an individual in any such capacity, or arising out of the status as such, whether or not the Association would have the power to indemnify against such liability under the provisions of this Article.
- 10.6 Amendment. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, the provisions of this Article 10 may not be amended without the prior written consent of all persons whose interest would be adversely affected by such amendment.

## ARTICLE 11 BYLAWS

The first Bylaws of the Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended, or rescinded in the manner provided in the Bylaws and the Declaration.

## ARTICLE 12 AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the following manner:

- 12.1 Notice. Notice of a proposed amendment shall be included in the notice of any meeting at which the proposed amendment is to be considered and shall be otherwise given in the time and manner provided in F.S. Chapter 617. Such notice shall contain the proposed amendment or a summary of the changes to be affected thereby.
- 12.2 Adoption. Amendments shall be proposed and adopted in the manner provided in F.S. Chapter 617 and in the Act (the latter to control over the former to the extent provided for in the Act).
- 12.3 Limitation. No amendment shall make any changes in the qualifications for membership, nor in the voting rights or property rights of members, nor any changes in Sections 4.3, 4.4, or 4.5 of Article 4, titled "Powers," without the approval in writing of all members and the joinder of all record Owners of mortgages upon Units. No amendment shall be made that is in conflict with the Act, the Declaration, or the Bylaws, nor shall any amendment make any changes that would in any way affect any of the rights, privileges, powers, or options herein provided in favor of or reserved to the Developer, or an affiliate, successor, or assign of the Developer unless the Developer shall join in the execution of the amendment. No amendment to this paragraph 12.3 shall be effective.
- 12.4 Developer Amendments. To the extent lawful, the Developer may amend these Articles consistent with the provisions of the Declaration, including, but not limited to, allowing certain amendments to be effected by the Developer alone.
- 12.5 Recording. A copy of each amendment shall be filed with the Secretary of State under the provisions of applicable Florida law, and a copy certified by the Secretary of State shall be recorded in the public records of Duval County, Florida.

## ARTICLE 13 INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE, ADDRESS AND NAME OF REGISTERED AGENT

The initial registered office of this Corporation shall be at 13961 Spoonbill St, N, Jacksonville, FL 32224, with the privilege of having its office and branch offices at other places within or without the State of Florida. The initial registered agent of the Corporation shall be the Keasler Law Firm, who shall also be a resident agent, whose address is 10407 Centurion Parkway N, Suite 112, Jacksonville, FL 32256
