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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

Panhandle Veterans Council, Inc. a Florida Not For Profit Corporation

The undersigned person(s), acting as incorporator of a corporation not for profit under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, as set forth in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, adopting the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLEI

The name of this corporation is Panhandle Veterans Council, Inc.,

ARTICLE II

This corporation shall have perpetual duration.

ARTICLE III

The corporation is a not for profit corporation. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

(a) The specific and primary purchases for which this corporation is formed are to operate for the advancement of charity and education and for other charitable and educational purposes, and particularly for the following purposes: generally bridging the gap for Florida veterans who have returned from previous combat experiences and are returning from combat experiences and who are or may be experiencing readjustment, vocational, medical, emotional, relationship and parenting

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challenges by providing opportunities for successful reintegration into society and more specifically doing the following with respect to veterans

- Empower veterans to be productive members of their community through successful reintegration.
- Assist veterans and family members with reunion and reconnection.
- Advocate for veterans and their families in the areas of employment, medical, psychological, education, housing, reunion, grief, financial planning, safety and security.
- Fill the gap by providing direct services, where services are limited, unavailable, inaccessible or are overwhelmed. Hire veterans to support veterans.
- Identify and develop specific programs for unique, diverse and high-risk populations (children, amputees, wounded, PTSD, homelessness, unemployed).
- 6. Coordinate public education to assist family members of returning and deployed veterans. Educate communities (school, medical, church, workplace) regarding the residual stigma of tragedy (combat death, suicide, abuse, PTSD, divorce, AIDs) and the need for sensitivity and continuing services.
- Produce media and print products required to educate the program participants, the community, and appraise funding sources of program progress.
- Partnership with National Guard and Reserve deployment managers, the Veterans
 Administration, Department of Defense, Department of Health and Human Services
 and local veteran organizations.
- Evaluate each program components so that effective strategies can be enhanced and ineffective elements can be climinated.

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(b) The general purposes for which this corporation is formed are to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes which will qualify it as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax taws, including, for those purposes, the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as tax exempt organizations under that Code.

(c) This corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation; nor shall it participate or intervene (by publication or distribution of any statements or otherwise) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLEIV

The corporation shall have a membership distinct from the board of directors. The authorized number and qualifications of the members of the corporation, the manner of their admission, the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting and other rights and privileges of members, and their liability for dues and assessments and the method of collecting dues and assessments shall be as regulated in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V

The street address of the initial principal office of the corporation is 2159 Briarwood Circle, City of Panama City, 32405, County of Bay, State of Florida. The name of its initial registered agent is Bill Bruhmuller whose address is 2159 Briarwood Circle, Panama City, FL 32405.

ARTICLE VI

The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its property controlled and its affairs conducted by a board of directors. The number of directors of the corporation shall be three; provided, however, that that number may be changed from time to time by a bylaw duly adopted pursuant to the Bylaws of this corporation.

The directors named here as the first board of directors shall hold office until the first meeting of members, to be held on December 5, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. CT, at 2159 BriarwoodCircle. Panama City, Florida, at which time an election of directors shall be held.

Directors elected at the first annual meeting, and at all subsequent times, shall serve for a term of one year until the annual meeting of members following the election of directors and until the qualification of the successors in office. Annual meetings shall be held at December 5 at 10:00 a.m. CT of each year at the principal office of the corporation, or at any other place or places designated by the board of directors by resolution.

Any action required or permitted to be taken by the board of directors under any provision of law may be taken without a meeting, if all the members of the board individually or collectively consent in writing to the action. Written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the board, and any action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as if taken by unanimous vote of the directors. Any certificate or other document filed under any provision of law that relates to action taken in this manner shall state that the action was taken by unanimous written consent of the board of directors without a meeting and that the articles of incorporation of this corporation authorize the directors to act in this manner. This statement shall be prima facic evidence of the directors authority.

<u>ARTICLE IX</u>

Subject to the limitations contained in the Bylaws and any limitations set forth in the Not For Profit Corporation. Act if Florida described above, concerning corporate action that must be authorized or approved by the members of the corporation, the Bylaws of this corporation may be made, altered, rescinded, added to or new Bylaws may be adopted, either by a resolution of the board of directors or by following the procedure set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLES X

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member, or to the benefit of any private individual.

ARTICLE XI

On the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of the corporation, shall be distributed to a not for profit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provision of any subsequent federal tax laws.

ARTICLE XII

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Amendments to these articles of incorporation my be proposed by a resolution adopted by the board of directors and presented to a quorum of members for their vote. Amendments may be adopted by a vote of at least two-thirds of a quorum of members of the corporation.
