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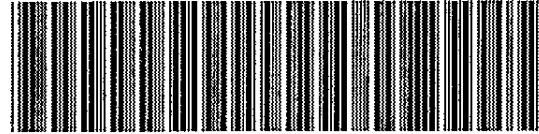

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
CAROLINE BARNES CENTER, INC.  
(A Florida Non-Profit Corporation)**

**ARTICLE I - NAME**

The name of this non-profit organization shall be called: Caroline Barnes Center, Inc.

**ARTICLE II - ADDRESS**

The mailing address and principal office of the corporation in the State of Florida is: 10650 Haverford Road, Suite #5, Jacksonville, FL 32218. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the principle office to any other address in the State of Florida.

**ARTICLE III - PURPOSE, POWER, AND NATURE OF BUSINESS**

(1) The general purpose of this corporation is to implement a dynamic community-based human services organization. Direct services will effectively strengthen families and communities by raising a level of consciousness through education, motivation, cultivation and empowerment.

(2) Targeted populations are: 1) families on a low or fixed income who rely heavily on government subsidies and are at high-risk; 3) children who have been removed from their home because their parents are incarcerated or on drugs. These children may themselves be involved with the juvenile justice system and may have committed misdemeanors; 4) children and adults who have behavioral health issues; 5) services for the elderly; and (6) group housing.

Skills/tools used for prevention and intervention are:

- Education (cognitive, literacy, math concepts & social skills;
- Cultural Arts and Crafts
- Parenting Classes & Child Advocacy
- HIV Education and Prevention
- Nutrition
- Budgeting Basics
- GED Assistance & Readiness

(3) Core values such as honesty, respect, discipline, love, structure, boundaries and limitations will be used to obtain goals and objectives. All of the above skills and tools will be taught and conducted by staff who are trained and certified to provide developmentally appropriate curriculums.

(4) To organize, maintain, finance, operate and conduct such corporation as may be proper to the above-mentioned purpose.

(5) Own, control, lease and purchase and to take by gift, devise and bequest, otherwise, and to convey, dispose of, mortgage, encumber, lease and in every respect to do all things and exercise all powers which a natural person might do and exercise over and about real estate, lease hold bonds, stocks and securities where ever the same may be situated or located.

(6) Maintain officers, headquarters, building or other facilities for accomplishing the object of this corporation.

(7) No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

(8) Do everything else which a natural person could do incident to, necessary to, or convenient in connection with the objects of the incorporation, to sue and be sued in ITT's corporate name.

(9) All of the foregoing purposes shall be exercised exclusively charitable and educational purposes in such a manner that the corporation will qualify as an exempt organization under section 501 © (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any United States Internal Revenue Law.

(10) All services shall be rendered to any family regardless of race, creed, sex, religion or natural origin.

#### **ARTICLE IV – APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS**


The initial appointment of the Board of Directors shall be made by the Incorporator. Future directors shall be assigned by recommendation of the existing board with a 2/3 majority vote, or as stated in the By-laws.


## ARTICLE V – DISSOLUTION


Upon winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the assets of the Corporation remaining after payment of all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to an organization recognized as exempt under Section 501© (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to be used exclusively for charitable and educational purposes.


