ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

06 SEP 21 PM 3: 48 FOR MGM Professional Center Condominium Association, Inc. a Florida Not-For-Profit Corporation

In compliance with the requirements of Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, the undersigned, all of whom are of full age, have this day voluntarily associated themselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation not-for-profit and do hereby certify:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation, herein called the "Association," is MGM Professional Center Condominium Association, Inc., and the corporate office address is 5475 Golden Gate Parkway, Suite 3 West, Naples, Florida 34116.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE AND POWERS: The purpose for which the Association is organized is to provide an entity pursuant to the Florida Condominium Act for the operation of MGM Professional Center, a Condominium, located in Collier County, Florida.

ARTICLE III

The Association is organized and shall exist upon a non-stock basis as a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, and no portion of any earnings of the Association shall be distributed or inure to the private benefit of any Member, Director or officer of the Association. For the accomplishment of its purposes, the Association shall have all of the common law and statutory powers and duties of a corporation not-for-profit under the laws of the State of Florida, and as provided in these Articles, the Declaration of Condominium, the Bylaws or the Florida Condominium Act; and it shall have all the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Condominium pursuant to the Declaration and as it may hereafter be amended, including, but not limited to the following:

- To make and collect Assessments against Members of the Association to defray the costs, expenses and losses of the Condominium, and to use the proceeds of Assessments in the exercise of its powers and duties.
- To maintain, repair, replace and operate the Condominium Property and Association Property.
- To purchase insurance upon the Condominium Property and Association Property for the protection of the Association, its Members, and their mortgagees.
- To reconstruct improvements after casualty and to make further improvements of the Property.

- E. To make, amend and enforce reasonable rules and regulations governing the use of the Common Elements.
- F. To approve or disapprove the transfer, mortgage, ownership and occupancy of Units, as provided by the Declaration of Condominium and the Bylaws.
- G. To enforce the provisions of the Condominium Act, the Declaration of Condominium, these Articles, and the Bylaws of the Association.
- H. To contract for the management and maintenance of the Condominium and to delegate any powers and duties of the Association in connection therewith except such as are specifically required by the Declaration of Condominium to be exercised by the Board of Directors or the membership of the Association.
- I. To employ accountants, attorneys, architects, and other personnel necessary to perform the services required for proper operation of the Condominium.
 - J. To acquire real and personal property in the name of the Association.

All funds and the title to all property acquired by the Association shall be held for the benefit of the Members in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration of Condominium, these Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP:

- A. The Members of the Association shall consist of all record owners of a fee simple interest in one (1) or more Units in the Condominium, and as further provided in the Bylaws; after termination of the Condominium, the Members shall consist of those who are Members at the time of such termination.
- B. After receiving approval of the Association as required by the Declaration of Condominium, change of membership shall be established by recording in the Public Records of Collier County, Florida, a deed or other instrument and by the delivery to the Association of a copy of such instrument.
- C. The share of a Member in the funds and assets of the Association cannot be assigned or transferred in any manner, except as an appurtenance to his Unit.
- D. The Owners of each Unit, collectively, shall be entitled to one (1) vote in Association matters as set forth in the Declaration of Condominium and Bylaws. The manner of exercising voting rights shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V

TERM: The term of the Association shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VI

BYLAWS: The Bylaws of the Association may be altered, amended, or rescinded in the manner provided therein.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENTS: Except as otherwise provided by Florida law, these Articles of Incorporation may be amended by vote of a majority of the voting interest at any annual or special meeting, or by approval in writing of the Owners of a majority of the Units without a meeting, provided that notice of any proposed amendment has been given to the Members of the Association, and that the notice contains a copy of the proposed amendment.

An amendment shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State and recording a copy in the Public Records of Collier County, Florida.

ARTICLE VIII

DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS:

- A. The affairs of the Association will be administered by a Board of Directors consisting of the number of Directors determined by the Bylaws, but not less than three (3) Directors, initially appointed by the Developer, and in the absence of such determination shall consist of three (3) Directors. Except for Directors appointed by the Developer, all Directors must be Members of the Association.
- B. Directors of the Association shall be elected by the Members in the manner determined by the Bylaws. Directors may be removed, and vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the Bylaws.
- C. The business of the Association shall be conducted by the officers designated in the Bylaws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the Members of the Association and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.

ARTICLE XII

INDEMNIFICATION:

The Association shall indemnify every Director and every officer of the Association against all expenses and liabilities, including attorneys' fees, actually and reasonably incurred by or imposed on him in connection with any legal proceeding (or settlement or appeal of such proceeding) to which he may be a party because of his being or having been a Director or officer of the Association. The foregoing right of indemnification shall not apply to:

- A. Gross negligence or willful misconduct in office by any Director or officer.
- B. Any criminal action, unless the Director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed was in, not opposed to, the best interest of the Association, and had no reasonable cause to believe his action was unlawful.

To the extent that a Director or officer has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in Subsection (A) or Subsection (B), or in

defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith.

The foregoing right of indemnification shall be in addition to and not exclusive of all other rights to which such Director or officer may be entitled.
