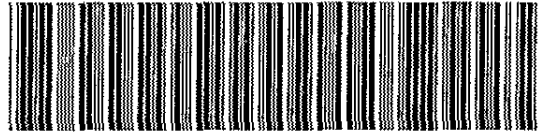

ARTICLE (III): Said Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distribution to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501 ©3 of the Internal Revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE (IV): The Directors of the Corporation shall be elected or appointed at the Annual meeting of the Board of Directors/Trustees held in the month of December.

ARTICLE VIII: No part of net earning of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments an distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth in article Three hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the published or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501©3 of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE (IX): Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501©3 of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or the state for local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed shall be dispose of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or for such organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
