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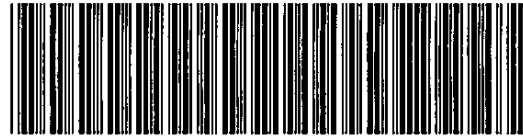



ATTACHMENT TO THE
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
THE CHURCH OF THE LIVING GOD OF BOYNTON BEACH, INC.

a Florida Not-for-Profit Corporation

ARTICLE III. PURPOSE:

(a) This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

(b) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in herein. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

(c) Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

(d) In furtherance of the above stated purposes, the corporation shall:

1. Establish, maintain and conduct regularly religious services, prayer meetings and religious educational programs of the Christian faith in the community;

2. Establish, maintain and provide religious social, cultural and educational outreach programs including but not limited to religious schooling, ministries and prayer meetings to support, promote and teach the Christian faith in the community;

3. To possess and exercise the powers to solicit and raise funds by any and all proper and appropriate means to further the religious purposes aforesaid and to receive and disburse

such funds accruing from offering, contributions, collections, donations or any other contributions for the general support of the corporation purposes.

4. To possess all the powers of a governing body of a parent church corporation in the State of Florida and in any state of the United States and to have the power to adapt a constitution and by-laws and to establish and maintain a tribunal to determine and adjudicate questions of faith, doctrine and church policy rules of order and regularity of discipline and to determine any and all ecclesiastical questions according to the jurisdiction
