### AMENDED AND RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

### ENTERPRISE VOLUSIA, INC.

(f/k/a Volusia County Business Development Corporation)

The Board of Directors of Volusia County Business Development Corporation, a Florida corporation-not-for profit, does hereby amend and restate the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation, and cause them to be filed with the Florida Department of State, in the manner prescribe by the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act.

### ARTICLE I (Name of Corporation)

The name of this corporation is ENTERPRISE VOLUSIA, INC. [hereinafter the "Corporation"].

### ARTICLE II (Enabling Authority for Establishment of Corporation)

This Corporation is organized under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes (Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act) and subject to the restrictions and limitations of an "exempt organization" under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code [the "Code"] and the corresponding regulations promulgated thereunder, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

### ARTICLE III (Exempt Purposes of the Corporation)

General Exempt Purpose. This Corporation is organized exclusively (a)

for charitable and educational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to The County of Volusia, a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Florida, or such other organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

- (b) <u>Specific Purposes</u>. Subject to the restrictions and limitations prescribed in these articles, the Corporation shall cooperate with public and private educational institutions and organizations, and with the various agencies of local government in Volusia County to foster and perpetuate the following educational and charitable purposes:
  - (1) To promote economic development in Volusia County;
- (2) To promote sustainable and environmentally responsible development projects that will provide for the expansion of the tax base of The County of Volusia and of the other taxing authorities in the county;
  - (3) To promote economic stability of Volusia County's labor force;
  - (4) To foster the creation of economic opportunities for all residents.
- (5) To provide economic data and research support necessary to educate and inform elected officials, prospective development persons interested in locating or expanding a business in Volusia County, regarding the quality of life in Volusia County and other economic, social, cultural advantages of living and working there.

### ARTICLE IV (Limitations Imposed by Federal Law)

(a) <u>Net Earnings of Corporation</u>. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers,

or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in the furtherance of the purposes prescribed in Article III.

(b) <u>Lobbying Restriction</u>. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign for public office.

(c) <u>General Restriction on Activities</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (ii) by a corporation, the contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Code.

# ARTICLE V (<u>Term of Existence of Corporation</u>)

This Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

# ARTICLE VII (<u>Oualification and Admission to Membership</u>)

Membership shall be open to any natural person, any corporation, and any other legal entity that resides in or has a principal office for the conduct of business within Volusia County, Florida. The manner of admission to membership and other matters relating to membership shall be as provided as in the Bylaws.

# ARTICLE VIII (Management of Corporation)

The general affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors. The number of directors (which shall not be less than three), the qualification of a directors, the term of office of directors, and the method of appointment or election shall be as provided in the bylaws of the Corporation. # ARTICLE IX (<u>Dissolution and Distribution of Assets</u>)

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more of the Corporation's "exempt purposes," within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall be distributed to The County of Volusia, a body corporate and a political subdivision of the State of Florida, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be distributed by a court of competent jurisdiction in Volusia County, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as the court shall determine have been organized and are being operated exclusively for such exempt purposes.

# ARTICLE IX (Principal Office, Registered Office and Registered Agent)

The county in the State of Florida in which the principal office of this corporation is to be located is the Volusia. The name and address of the Corporation's initial registered agent is Frank A. Ford, 110 West Indiana Avenue, DeLand, Florida 32720.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation, which do not require approval by the members of the Corporation, were duly adopted at a meeting of the Board of Directors, by majority vote of the directors in office, on December 16, 1999, effective as of January 1, 2000, or upon filing with the Florida Department

of State, whichever date shall last occur, in accordance with sections 617.1002 and 617.1007, Florida Statutes.
