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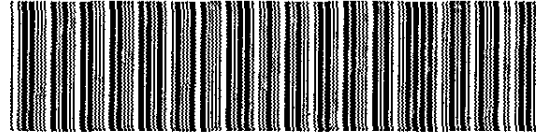

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION**

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a not for profit corporation pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

**ARTICLE I - NAME**

The name of the corporation shall be LIVING STONES INTERNATIONAL, INC.

**ARTICLE II - PRINCIPAL OFFICE/MAILING ADDRESS**

The principal place of business of the corporation is 3420 Connell Drive, Pensacola, FL 32503  
and the mailing address is PO Box 2322, Pensacola, Florida 32513.

**ARTICLE III - DURATION**

The corporation shall have perpetual duration.

**ARTICLE IV - PURPOSE**

The corporation is a not for profit corporation organized and existing for religious and charitable purposes. The main purpose of this organization is to propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ by all available means, both at home and in foreign lands. Further, the general purposes for which this corporation is formed are to operate exclusively for such religious and charitable purposes as will qualify it as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as tax-exempt under that Code.

The specific purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- (1) To promote the teaching and preaching of Bible based principles.
- (2) To promote marriage and family
- (3) To produce and distribute Biblical teaching materials; such as, printing, audio and video CDs and DVDs, seminars, and publications.
- (4) To assist in training ministry counselors, teachers, and group leaders.
- (5) To receive financial offerings, fees, contributions, gifts and property from its resources in order to carry out the purposes of the corporation.
- (6) To use its income and property for the purpose of corporate administration and to assist other Christian ministries, ministers, and missionaries.
- (7) Subject to any limitation set forth in the By-laws, to borrow money and secure the same, and issue bonds of the corporation for the purpose of building, repairing and maintaining or renting structures or equipment which is to be used in connection with the purposes of the corporation.

- (8) To make, enter into and perform contracts of every kind and description necessary, advisable or expedient in carrying out the purposes of the corporation, and to that end to receive, hold and administer the funds of the corporation for the said purposes.
- (9) To have and maintain one or more offices within the State of Florida and conduct any of its affairs in the State of Florida or elsewhere within and without the United States.
- (10) To have the authority, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things necessary, useful, suitable, desirable or proper for the furtherance and attainment of purposes of the corporation.

#### **ARTICLE V - MANNER OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

The manner in which the directors are elected or appointed is set forth in the By-laws of the corporation.

#### **ARTICLE VI - LIMITATION OF POWERS**

(1). No Private Inurement: No part of the net earnings of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, members, trustees, officers, directors or private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles.

(2). No Political Activity: No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

(3). No Unpermitted Activities: Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986 or any corresponding section of any future federal tax code or by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

(4). Distribution of Assets Upon Dissolution: Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious or charitable purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

## ARTICLE VII - DIRECTORS/OFFICERS

The corporation is organized on a non-stock basis and shall have no members. The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its property controlled, and its affairs under the direction of and conducted by a board of directors. The number of directors shall be four, provided the number of directors may be changed by the board as long as there are never less than three.

The initial board of directors shall be chosen by the incorporator. Officers shall be nominated and elected by the appointed directors. The initial directors and officers shall serve until the next annual meeting of the corporation. The election of officers and directors shall take place at the annual meeting in the manner as set forth in the By-laws of the organization. Officers and directors of this organization shall be elected for a term of one year. Persons officially on duty when election of directors and officers is held shall be permitted to vote by absentee ballot.

Unless otherwise provided in By-laws, the corporation shall have as officers a president, one or more vice-presidents, a secretary, and a treasurer which shall be chosen by the board of directors and the officers shall serve at the pleasure of the board of directors.

The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held in December of each year on the date set by the President. Annual meetings of the corporation may be held in or out of the State of Florida.

Amendments to these Articles of Incorporation may be made by the board of directors by resolution adopted by two-thirds vote of a quorum of directors.
