ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

SECRETARY OF STATE TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA

The undersigned incorporator, by these Articles, does so for the purplese of forming a not-for-profit corporation pursuant to the laws of the State of Florida (Chapter 720, Florida Statutes), and hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the Corporation shall be Trio Commons Community Association, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation. For convenience, the Corporation shall be referred to in this instrument as the "Association" or the "Corporation," these Articles of Incorporation as the "Articles," and the By-Laws of the Association as the "By-Laws."

ARTICLE IJ PURPOSE

The purpose for which the Association is organized is to provide an entity pursuant to the Florida Homeowner's Association Act, Chapter 720, Florida Statutes (the "Act") for the operation of that certain Homeowner's Association to be known as Trio Commons Community Association, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation (the "Association"), which may be established in Miami-Dade County, Florida, and which the developer elects to be governed by the Association. The developer of the Association is Trio Co-Operative Apartments, a Florida corporation, and is hereinafter referred to as the "Developer."

ARTICLE III DEPINITIONS

The terms used in these Articles shall have the same definitions and meaning as those set forth in the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions ("Declaration") for the Homeowner's Association, and the By-Laws of the Association, unless herein provided to the contrary, or unless the context otherwise requires.

ARTICLE IV POWERS

The powers of the Association shall include and be governed by the (blidwing:

4.1 <u>General</u>. The Association shall have all of the common law and statutory powers of a not-for-profit Corporation under the laws of Florida that are not in conflict with the grovisions of these Articles or of the Act.

4.2 <u>Enumeration</u>. The Association shall have all the powers and duties set forth in the Act (except as to variances in these Articles and the Declaration which are permitted by the Act). and all of the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Homepwher's Association pursuant to its Declaration, and as they may be amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, the following:

To make and collect Assessments and other charges against Members as A. Parcel Owners, and to use the proceeds thereof in the exercise of its powers and duties.

To buy, own, operate, lease, sell and trade both real and be/sonal property as B may be necessary or convenient in the administration of the Association.

To maintain, repair, replace, reconstruct, add to, and operate the Association C. and other property acquired or leased by the Association for use by Parcel Olyners.

> D. To purchase insurance upon the Association and insuration for the protection

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of the Association, its officers, directors, and Members as Parcel Owners, and such other parties as the Association may determine in the best interest of the Association.

E. To make and amend reasonable rules and regulations for the maintenance, conservation and use of the Association and for the health, comfort, safety and welfare of the Parcel Owners.

F. To approve or disapprove the leasing, transfer, mortg#gling, ownership and possession of Parcels as may be provided by the Declaration.

G. To enforce by legal means the provisions of the Act, the Declaration, these Articles, the By-Laws, and the rules and regulations for the use of the Association.

H. To contract for the management of the Association, and to delegate to the party with whom such contract has been entered into all of the powers and duties of the Association, except (1) those which require specific approval of the Board of Directors or the membership of the Association; (2) those which are incapable of being delegated as same may be contrary to the Declaration or the By-Laws; (3) those which are contrary to the Statutes of the State of Florida; and (4) wherein a delegation is a power and duty which by its very nature is a decision or fiduciary responsibility to be made by the Board of Directors and is therefore not susceptible of delegation.

1. To employ personnel to perform the services required the proper operation of the Association.

J. To enter into agreements with other parties for easements or sharing arrangements or recreational facilities as the Board of Directors may deem if the best interests of the Association.

4.3 <u>Assets of the Association</u>. All funds and the titles of all properties acquired by the Association and their proceeds shall be held for the benefit and use of the Members in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration, these Articles, and the By-Laws.

4.4 <u>Limitation</u>. The powers of the Association shall be subject to and shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration and the By-Laws.

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ARTICLE V MEMBERS

5.1 <u>Membership</u>. The Members of the Association shall consist of all of the record Owners of Parcels; and, after termination of the Association, if same shall occur, the Members of the Association shall consist of those who are Members at the time of the termination, and their successors and assigns. Membership shall be established by the acquisition of ownership of fee title to, or fee interest in, a Parcel, whether by conveyance, devise, judicial decree, or otherwise subject to the provisions of the Declaration, and by the recordation amongst the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida, of the deed or other instrument establishing the acquisition and designating the Parcel affected thereby, and by the delivery to the Association of a true copy of such deed or other instrument. The new Owner designated in such deed or other Instrument shall thereupon become a Member of the Association, and the membership of the prior Owner as to the Parcel designated shall be terminated.

5.2 <u>Assignment</u>. The share of a Member in the funde and assets of the Association, in its Common Elements and its Common Surplus, and membership in this Association, cannot be assigned, hypothecated or transferred in any manner except as an appurtenence to the Parcel for which that share is held.

5.3 <u>Voting</u>. On all matters upon which the membership shall be entitled to vote, there shall be only one (1) vote for each Parcel. Said votes shall be exercised of cast in the manner provided by the Declaration and By-Laws. Any person or entity owning more than one (1) Parcel shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each Parcel owned.

5.4 <u>Meetings</u>. The By-Laws shall provide for an annual meeting of Members, and may make provision for regular and special meetings of Members other than the annual meeting.

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ARTICLE VI TERM OF EXISTENCE

The Association shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE VII INCORPORATOR

ARTICLE VIII OFFICERS

The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the officers designated in the By-Laws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Association at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the Members of the Association, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The By-Laws may provide for the removal from officer of officers, for filling Vacancies, and for the duties of the officers. The names and addresses of the initial officers who shall serve until their successors are designated by the Board of Directors are as follows:

DIRECTORS

9.1 <u>Number and Qualification</u>. The property, business and affairs of the Association shall be managed by a board consisting of the number of directors: determined by the By-Laws, but which shall consist of not less than three (3) directors. Directors do not have to be Members of the Association.

9.2 <u>Duties and Powers</u>. All of the duties and powers of the Association existing under the Act, the Declaration, these Articles and the By-Laws shall be exercised exclusively by the Board of Directors, its agents, contractors or employees, subject only to approval by Parcel Owners when that is specifically required.

9.3 <u>Election: Removal</u>. Directors of the Association shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Members in the manner determined by the By-Laws. Directors may be removed and vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the By-Laws.

9.4 <u>Term of Developer's Directors</u>. The Developer shall appoint the members of the first Board of Directors who shall hold office for the periods described in the By-Lews.

9.5 <u>First Directors</u>. The names and addresses of the members of the first Board of Directors; who shall hold office until their successors are elected and have qualified, are as follows:

ARTICLE X

10.1 Indemnity. To the extent permitted by law, the Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party, to any threatened, pending or contemplated action, sult or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the Association) by reason of the fact that ne is or was a director, employee, officer or agent of the Association, against expenses (including) attorney's fees and appellate attorney's fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with such action, sult or proceeding if he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interest of the Association; and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, he had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful; except, that no indemnification shall be made in respectiof any claim, issue or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for gross negligence or willful extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine, upon application, that despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitied to indemnify for such expenses which such court shall deem proper. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nole contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interest of the Association, the destination of action of the association of such as a brought shall determine, upon application, that despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitied to indemnify for such expenses which such court shall deem proper. Th

10.2 <u>Expenses</u>. To the extent that a director, officer, employee or agent of the Association has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in Article 10.1 above, or in defense of any claim, issue primatter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorney's fees and appellate attorney's fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith.

10.3 <u>Approval</u>. Any indemnification under Article 10.1 above (unless ordered by a court) shall be maderby the Association only as authorized in the specific case uportal determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee or agent is proper in the circumstances because he has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Article 10.1 above. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, or (b) if such quorum is notobtainable, or, even if obtainable a quorum of disinterested directors so directs, by independent legal coursel in a written opinion, or (c) by a majority of the Members.

10.4 <u>Advances</u>. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the Association in edvance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding as authorized by the Board of Directors in the specific case upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the directors, officer, employee or agent to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he is entitled to be indemnified by the Association as authorized in this Article.

10.5 <u>Miscellaneous</u>. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any By-Law, agreement, vote of Members or otherwise, both as to action in his official capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a parson who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such a person.

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10.6 <u>Insurance</u>. The Association shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the Association, or is or was serving at the request of the Association as a director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise against any liability asserted against him and incurred by him in any such capacity, or arising out of his status as such, whether or not the Association would have the power to indemnify him against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

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ARTICLE XI BY-LAWS

The first By-Laws of the Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended or rescinded by the directors and Members in the mannal provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the following manner.

12.1 <u>Notice</u>. Notice of the subject matter of a proposed amendment shall be included in the notice of any meeting at which a proposed amendment is to be considered.

12.2 <u>Adoption</u>. A resolution for the adoption of a proposed amendment may be proposed either by a majority of the Board of Directors or by not less than one-third (1/3) of the Mombers of the Association. Directors and Members not present in person or by proxy at the meeting considering the amendment may express their approval in writing, provided that approval is delivered to the secretary at or prior to the meeting. The approvals must be either:

A. Not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the entire membership of the Board of Directors and by not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the votes of the entire membership of the Association; or

B. By not less than ninety percent (90%) of the votes of the entire membership of the Association.

12.3 <u>Limitation</u>. No amendment shall make any changes in the qualifications for membership nor in the voting rights or property rights of Members, nor any changes in Articles 4.3 and 4.4 of Article 4, entitled "Powers," without approval in writing by all Members and the Joinder of all record owners of mortgages upon Parcels. No amendment shall be made that is in conflict with the Act or the Declaration, nor shall any amendment make any changes which would in any way affect any of the rights, privileges, powers or options herein provided in favor of or reserved to the developer, or an affiliate, beneficiary or designee of the Developer, unless the Developer shall join in the execution of the amendment.

12.4 <u>Recording</u>. A copy of each amendment shall be filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of the applicable Florida Statutes, and a copy cartified by the Secretary of State shall be recorded in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida

ARTICLE XIII DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution or final liquidation of the Association, the sisters, both real and personal of the Association, including drainage easements, shall, upon request by the appropriate public agency or utility, be dedicated to such public agency or utility to be devoted to purposes, as nearly as practicable, the same as those to which they were required to be devoted by the Association. In the event that such dedication is refused acceptance, such assets shall be granted, conveyed and assigned to any non-profit corporation, association, trust or other organization, to be devoted to purposes as nearly as practicable to the same as those to which they were required to be devoted to be devoted to purpose as nearly as practicable to the same as those to which they were required to be devoted by the Association. No such disposition of Association properties shall be effective to divest or diminish any right or title of any Parcel Owner vested in him under the recorded Declaration Declaration and deeds.

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ARTICLE XIV ADDRESS

The principal place of business of the Corporation shall be located at 9450 E. Broadview Drive, Bay Harbor Island, FL 33154, but the Corporation may maintain offices and transact business in such other places within or without the State of Florida as may from time to time be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XV INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE ADDRESS AND NAME OF REGISTERED AGENT

The initial registered office of this Corporation shall be located at 4000 Hollywood Boulevard, Suite 375-South, Hollywood, Florida 33021, and the initial registered agent of the Corporation at that address is JEFFREY S. BERLOWITZ, ESQ.
