
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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit pursuant to the

laws of the State of Florida, does hereby adopt the following articles of incorporation.

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation shall be DAMES POINT CROSSING CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION, INC. For convenience, the corporation shall be referred to in this instrument as the "Association", these Articles of Incorporation as the "Articles" and the Bylaws of the Association as the "Bylaws".

ARTICLE II DEFINITIONS

The terms used in these Articles shall have the same definitions and meaning as those set forth in the Declaration of the Condominium to be recorded in the Public Records of Duval County, Florida, unless herein provided to the contrary, or unless the context otherwise requires.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purpose for which the Association is organized is to provide an entity pursuant to the Florida Condominium Act (the "Act") as it exists on the date hereof for the operation of the condominium to be known as DAMES POINT CROSSING, A CONDOMINIUM to be located in Duval County, Florida (the "Condominium").

ARTICLE IV DUTIES

In accordance with the Plat, Dames Point Crossing Association, Inc. is responsible for maintenance of the surface water and stormwater management system(s) permitted by the St. Johns River Water Management District permit no. 40-031-63487-3, which permit is in compliance pursuant to Compliance Number 518223. Should the Master Association default in its duties, the Association will assume maintenance of the portions of the surface water and stormwater management system located within the Condominium Property.

ARTICLE V **POWERS**

The powers of the Association shall include and be governed by the following:

General. The Association shall have all of the common law and statutory powers of a corporation not for profit under the laws of Florida that are not in conflict with the provisions of these Articles, the Declaration, the Bylaws or the Act.

- 5.2 <u>Enumeration</u>. The Association shall have all of the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Condominium pursuant to the Declaration, and as more particularly described in the Bylaws, as the Declaration and Bylaws may be amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, the following:
- (a) To make and collect Assessments, Special Assessments and other charges against members as Unit Owners, and to use the proceeds thereof in the exercise of its powers and duties.
- (b) To buy, own, operate, lease, sell, trade and mortgage both real and personal property as may be necessary or convenient in the administration of the Condominium.
- (c) To maintain, repair, replace, reconstruct, add to and operate the Condominium, and other property acquired or leased by the Association for use by Unit Owners.
- (d) To purchase insurance upon the Condominium and insurance for the protection of the Association, its officers, directors and members as Unit Owners.
- (e) To make and amend reasonable rules and regulations for the maintenance, conservation and use of the Condominium and for the health, comfort, safety and welfare of the Unit Owners.
- (f) To approve or disapprove the leasing, transfer, mortgaging, ownership and possession of Units as may be provided by the Declaration.
- (g) To enforce by legal means the provisions of the Act, the Declaration, these Articles, the Bylaws, and the rules and regulations for the use of the Condominium.
- (h) To contract for the management and maintenance of the Condominium and to authorize a management agent (which may be an affiliate of the Developer) to assist the Association in carrying out its powers and duties by performing such functions as the submission of proposals collection of Assessments, Special Assessments, preparation of records, enforcement of rules and maintenance, repair and replacement of the Common Elements with funds as shall be made available by the Association for such purposes. The Association shall, however, retain at all times the powers and duties granted by the Condominium Documents and the Act, including but not limited to the making of Assessments, Special Assessments, promulgation of rules and the execution of contracts on behalf of the Association.
- (i) To employ personnel to perform the services required for the proper operation of the Condominium.
- 5.3 <u>Assessments for Stormwater Management System.</u> The Association shall levy and collect adequate assessments against members of the Association for the costs of maintenance and operation of the surface water or stormwater management system.
- 5.4 <u>Assets of the Association</u>. All funds and the titles of all properties acquired by the Association and their proceeds shall be held for the benefit and use of the members in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration, these Articles and the Bylaws.

- 5.5 <u>Distribution of Income</u>; <u>Dissolution</u>. The Association shall make no distribution of income to its members, directors or officers, and upon dissolution all assets of the Association shall be transferred to a profit corporation or a public agency, except in the event of a termination of all the Condominium or as otherwise authorized under Chapter 617 of Florida Statutes.
- 5.6 <u>Limitation</u>. The powers of the Association shall be subject to and shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions hereof and of the Declaration, the Bylaws and the Act.

ARTICLE VI ASSESSMENTS

The assessments shall be used for the maintenance and repair of the surface water or stormwater management systems including but not limited to work within retention areas, drainage structures and drainage easements.

ARTICLE VII MEMBERS

- 7.1 <u>Membership</u>. The members of the Association shall consist of all of the record owners of Units in the Condominium from time to time, and after termination of any or all of the Condominiums shall consist of those who were members at the time of such termination, and their successors and assigns.
- 7.2 <u>Assignment</u>. The share of a member in the funds and assets of the Association cannot be assigned, hypothecated or transferred in any manner except as an appurtenance to the Unit for which that share is held.
- 7.3 <u>Voting</u>. On all matters upon which the membership shall be entitled to vote, there shall be only one vote for each Unit, which vote shall be exercised or cast in the manner provided by the Declaration and Bylaws. Any person or entity owning more than one Unit shall be entitled to one vote for each Unit owned.
- 7.4 Meetings. The Bylaws shall provide for an annual meeting of members, and may make provision for regular and special meeting of members other than the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VIII TERM OF EXISTENCE

Existence of the Association shall commence with the filing of these Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State, Tallahassee, Florida. The Association shall exist in perpetuity.

ARTICLE X
OFFICERS

The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the officers holding the offices designated in the Bylaws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Association at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the members of the Association and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The Bylaws may provide for the removal from office of officers, for filling vacancies and for the duties of the officers. The names and addresses of the officers who shall serve until their successors are designated by the Board of Directors are as follows:

ARTICLE XI

- Number and Oualification. The property, business and affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board consisting of the number of directors determined in the manner provided by the Bylaws but which shall consist of not less than three directors. Except for Directors appointed by the Developer, all Directors must be members (Unit Owners) of the Association.
- 11.2 <u>Duties and Powers</u>. All of the duties and powers of the Association existing under the Act, the Declaration, these Articles and the Bylaws shall be exercised exclusively by the Board of Directors, its agents, contractors or employees, subject only to approval by Unit Owners when such approval is specifically required.
- 11.3 <u>Election; Removal</u>. Directors of the Association shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members in the manner determined by and subject to the qualifications set forth in

the Bylaws. Directors may be removed and vacancies on the Board shall be filled in the manner provided by the Bylaws.

- 11.4 <u>Term of Developer's Directors</u>. The Developer of the Condominium shall appoint the members of the first Board of Directors and their replacements who shall hold office for the periods described in the Bylaws.
- 11.5 <u>First Directors</u>. The names and addresses of the members of the first Board of Directors who shall hold office until their successors are elected and have qualified, as provided in the Bylaws, are as follows:

ARTICLE XII INDEMNIFICATION

12.1 Indemnity. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or contemplated action suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that he is or was a Director, employee, officer or agent of the Association, against expenses (including attorneys' fees and appellate attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with such action, suit or proceedings, if he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, has no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful, except that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue or matter as to which such person shall have adjudged to be liable for gross negligence or misfeasance or malfeasance in the performance of his duty to the Association, unless and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all of the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses which such court shall deem proper. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the Association, and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful.

- 12.2 Expenses. To the extent that a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Association has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in Section 12.1 above, or in defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees and appellate attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith.
- 12.3 Approval. Any indemnification under Section 12.1 above (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the Association only as authorized in the specific case upon a determination that indemnification of the Director, officer, employee or agent is proper under the circumstances because he has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 10.1 above. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, or (b) if such quorum is not obtainable, or, even if obtainable, if a quorum of disinterested Directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion, or by a majority of the voting interests of the members.
- Advances. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the Association in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding as authorized by the Board of Directors in any specific case upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the affected Director, officer, employee or agent to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he is entitled to be indemnified by the Association as authorized in this Section 12.
- Miscellaneous. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any Bylaw, agreement, vote of members or otherwise, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Director, officer, employee or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs and personal representatives of such person.

ARTICLE XIII BYLAWS

The first Bylaws of the Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended or rescinded by the Directors, members and the Developer in the manner provided in the Bylaws and the Declaration.

ARTICLE XIV AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the following manner:

- 14.1 <u>Notice</u>. Notice of the subject matter of a proposed amendment shall be included in the notice of any meeting at which the proposed amendment is to be considered.
- 14.2 <u>Adoption</u>. A resolution for the adoption of a proposed amendment may be proposed either by a majority of the Board of Directors or by not less than one-third of the voting interests of the members of the Association. The approval must be:

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- (a) at any time, by not less than 66-2/3% of the votes of all members of the Association represented at a meeting at which a quorum has been attained and by not less than 66-2/3 percent of the entire Board of Directors; or
- (b) after control of the Association is turned over to Unit Owners other than the Developer, by not less than 80% of the votes of the members of the Association represented at a meeting at which a quorum has been attained; or
- (c) after control of the Association is turned over to Unit Owners other than the Developer, by not less than 60% of the entire Board of Directors; or
- (d) before control of the Association is turned over to Unit Owners other than the Developer, by not less than 66 2/3% of the entire Board of Directors.
- 14.3 <u>Limitation</u>. Provided, however, that no amendment shall make any changes in the qualifications of membership nor in the voting rights or property rights of members, nor any changes in Sections 5.3, 5.4 and 5.5 of Article V, entitled "Powers," without the approval in writing of all members and the joinder of all record owners of mortgages upon Units. No amendment shall be made that is in conflict with the Act, the Declaration or the Bylaws, nor shall any amendment make any changes which would in any way affect any of the rights, privileges, powers or options herein provided in favor of or reserved to the Developer, or an affiliate of the Developer, unless the Developer shall join in the execution of the amendment.
- 14.4 <u>Recording</u>. A copy of each amendment shall be filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of applicable Florida law, and a copy certified by the Secretary of State shall be recorded in the public records of Duval County, Florida.

ARTICLE XV INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE; ADDRESS AND NAME OF REGISTERED AGENT

The initial registered office of the Association shall be at 1301 Riverplace Boulevard, Suite 1500, Jacksonville, Florida 32207, with the privilege of having its office and branch offices at other places within or without the State of Florida. The initial registered agent at that address shall be Lynda R. Aycock.

ARTICLE XVI TERMINATION, DISSOLUTION, OR LIQUIDATION

In the event of termination, dissolution or final liquidation of the Association, the responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the surface water or stormwater management system must be transferred to and accepted by an entity which would comply with Section 40C-42.027, F.A.C., and be approved by the St. Johns River Water Management District prior to such termination, dissolution or liquidation.

ARTICLE XVII PRINCIPAL OFFICE
