ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF Sunrays' Booster Club, Inc.

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under the Fiorida Not-For-Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes Chapter 617, makes and adopts the following articles of incorporation:

Article 1,

Name

The name of the corporation is as follows: Sunrays' Booster Club, Inc.

Article 2. Address

The address of the principal office and the mailing address of the corporation is: 10255 SW 127^{th} Court, Miami, FL 33186.

Article 3.

Initial Registered Office and Agent

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is: Kramer & Rassner, P.A., 7700 SW 88 Street, Suite 510, Miami, Miami-Dade County, FL 33156. The name of its initial registered agent at that address is: Wayne H. Rassner.

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4.

No Members

The corporation shall not have members and shall not issue membership certificates. The corporation shall not issue shares of stock.

Article

_5.

Not For Profit

The corporation is a not-for-profit corporation under Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. The corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of its directors or officers, except to the extent permissible under these articles, under law and under 26 U.S.C.A. 5 501(c)(3) (referred to below as "code"). If the corporation ever has members, no member shall have any vested right, interest or privilege in or to the assets, income or property of the corporation and no part of the income or assets of the corporation shall be distributable to or for the benefit of its members, except to the extent permissible under these Articles, under law and under 26 U.S.C.A. 5 501(c)(3).

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Article 6. Duration

The duration (term) of the corporation is perpetual.

Article 7、 Purposes

The corporation is organized, and shall be operated exclusively for the support of amateur gymnastics. Sunrays' Booster Club, Inc. is operated exclusively for the charitable purpose of supporting the Sunrays amateur gymnastics teams. Its functions are as follows, but not limited to:

1) Seek and provide personal & corporate sponsorship and fundraising opportunities for its members to offset competition related expenses;

2) Administrative support to its members by submitting gymnastics' meets entry forms, USAG/AAU membership renewals, and college recommendations;

3) Providing scholarship funds for needy athletes; and,

4) Purchasing new training equipment to allow the athletes the best opportunities to learn new skills safely and in a timely manner

Article 8. Powers

Solely for the above purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:

A. Anything in these articles of incorporation to the contrary notwithstanding, the purpose or purposes for which this corporation is organized are limited to those that will qualify it as an exempt organization under <u>26 U.S.C.A. 5 501(c)(3)</u>, including, for those purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as tax-exempt organizations under the Internal Revenue Code.

This corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation. This corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

No part of the net earnings, properties or assets of this corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual or any member or director of this corporation. On liquidation or dissolution all properties and assets of this corporation remaining after paying or providing for all debts and obligations shall be distributed and paid over to a fund, foundation or corporation organized and operated for charitable or religious purposes designated by the board of directors which shall at the time qualifies as a tax-exempt organization under 26 U.S.C.A. 5 501(c)(3), or as that statute may be amended.

B. To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida on nonprofit corporations, including but not limited to those set forth in Plorida Statutes Chapter 617 and the following powers: to acquire by bequest, devise, gift, grant,

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donation, contribution, purchase, lease or otherwise any property of any sort or nature without limitation as to its amount or value, and to hold, invest, reinvest, manage, use, apply, employ, sell, expend, disburse, lease, mortgage, convey, option, donate or otherwise dispose of the property and the income, principal and proceeds of the property.

C. To engage in and transact any other lawful activity, solely in furtherance of the above purposes, for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under the Florida Not-For-Profit Corporation Act, and any successor or amendment to the Florida Not-For-Profit Corporation Act.

D. To do any other things as are incidental to the powers of the corporation or necessary or desirable in order to accomplish the purposes of the corporation.

Article 9.

Limitation 1

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of or be distributable to its members (if the corporation ever has any), directors or officers, but the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 7 (Purposes) of these Articles.

Article 10.

Tax Exempt Status

It is intended that the corporation shall have and continue to have the status of a corporation that is exempt from federal income taxation 26 U.S.C.A. <u>5</u> 501(a) as an organization described in <u>26</u> U.S.C.A. <u>6</u> 501(c)(<u>3</u>) and which is other than a private foundation as defined in <u>26</u> U.S.C.A. <u>6</u> 509. These articles shall be construed accordingly, and all powers and activities of the corporation shall be limited accordingly. The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation to such an extent as would result in the loss of exemption under <u>26</u> U.S.C.A. <u>6</u> 501(c)(<u>3</u>). All references in these articles to sections of the Internal Revenue Code shall be considered references to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as from time to time amended, and to the corresponding provisions of any similar law subsequently enacted.

Article

12.

Dissolution

On the dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, distribute all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes in such manner and to such qualified organization or organizations as the board of directors shall determine. Any of the assets not so distributed shall be distributed in accordance with the direction of any court having jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for the above purposes of the corporation or to a qualified organization or organizations as the court shall determine. Por purposes of this article, an organization is a "qualified organization" only if, at the time of receiving the assets, it is operated exclusively for the purposes described in 26 U.S.C.A. § 170(c)(1) or 26 U.S.C.A. § 170(c)(2)(B) and as described in 26 U.S.C.A. § 509(a)(1), (2) or (3).

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Article 13. Board of Directors

There shall be a board of directors consisting of at least three individuals. The initial directors are elected by the incorporators. After that, each director shall be elected by majority vote of the board of directors in the manner and at the times set forth in the bylaws. Any director may be removed by the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the board of directors.

ARTICLE

14. Officers

The officers of the corporation may consist of a president, one or more vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer, and any other officers and assistant officers as may be provided for in the bylaws or by resolution of the board of directors. Each officer shall be elected by majority vote of the board of directors (and may be removed by majority vote of the board of directors) at such a time and in such a manner as may be prescribed by the bylaws or by law.

The corporation shall indemnify each director and officer, including former directors and officers, to the fullest extent allowed by law, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 617. It is intended that the corporation be an organization the officers and directors of which are immune from civil liability to the extent provided under Florida Statutes Chapter 617 and other similar laws.
