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ARTICLE III PURPOSE

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¹. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

To protect, educate, support, and empower those who have been faced with hardship, abuse, and neglect. To help guide, protect, direct, educate, mentor, elevate, and empower those who are faced with difficulties on a daily basis. The corporation aims to be a part of the solution by helping those who have been experiencing rejection, discrimination, abuse, and social exclusion within their communities and society. The programs of the corporation focus not only on personal issues, but also on restoring spiritual healing and holistic well-being in each individual, provoking spiritual completeness. The corporations programs will focus not only on the past and present generation, but also on the welfare of the future generations to come. Following is a description of each program the corporation offers.

<u>Outreach Protection Care Program For The Elderly</u>- The purpose of this program is to ensure the elderly in our community are cared for and protected from neglect and abuse. This will be accomplished by case management and assessment. The program will provide home care, companionship and transportation to and from the program. The program will also provide transportation for doctor visits and grocery shopping. In addition the program will offer social functions for the elderly.

<u>Outreach Program Tutoring and Mentoring</u>- The purpose of this program is to tutor children who are falling behind in school or are faced with learning difficulties. Members of the staff will assist children with school work and mentor them to build their self esteem. This program is available for children ages 5 to 17.

<u>Mental Illness Outreach Program</u>- The purpose of this program is to assess the needs of individuals suffering from mental illness and ensure those needs are being met. The program will provide advocacy, case management, and community support. The program will also provide activity and therapeutic groups, support groups, professional relaxation, and insight groups.

<u>HIV Outreach Program/HIV Intervention Program-</u> The purpose of this program is to offer counseling, psychotherapy and informative counseling and mentoring for individuals diagnosed with HIV. The program will also offer support groups.

<u>Domestic Violence Outreach Program</u>. The purpose of this program is to provide counseling to victims of domestic violence. The organization will liaison with the Orange County Court to help women take out injunctions. The program will also help victims of domestic violence to obtain state funding to relocate, if they wish, in situations where the individual's life is in danger.

<u>Prison and Probation Outreach</u>. The purpose of this program is to provide spiritual mentoring to individuals in the prison systems and those recently released from prison. The program will also assist these individuals in setting goals and try to help them achieve these goals. The program aims to institute a GED program, the purpose of which will be to tutor individuals to prepare them to take the GED exam. The program will also provide job placement assistance and attempt to ensure the individuals are fairly compensated.

<u>Drugs and Alcohol Rehabilitation Program-</u> The purpose of this program is to provide counseling, insight groups, and support groups to individuals addicted to drugs and alcohol. A graduation program will be held for individuals who have remained clean for one years. This program also aims to offer the same GED program as mentioned above in the Prison and Probation Outreach Program.

<u>Recover Outreach Program For Soldiers-</u> The purpose of this program is to offer counseling, case management and support group to soldiers returning from war, veterans, and their families. Participants in the program will undergo emotional and stress assessments. The program will also offer Bereavement counseling for families who have lost a loved one at war.

The names of each program are proposed names and may be changed by the corporation at any time.

The corporation is faith based, but not discriminatory of any faith. The corporation will offer inspirational messages from the Bible to those who don't have a conflicting religious belief.
