ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
OVERFLOW OUTREACH MISSIONARY SUPPORT CENTER, INC
A NONPROFIT FLORIDA CORPORATION

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DIVISION OF CORPORATIONS

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ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this corporation is OVERFLOW OUTREACH MISSIONARY SUPPORT CENTER, INC, a nonprofit Florida Corporation.

ARTICLE II

PRINCIPLE OFFICE

The area in this state where the principal office and the Headquarters of the Corporation is to be located is the City of Valrico, Hillsborough County. The mailing address of this corporation shall be 909 Inner Gary Pl, Valrico Florida 33594. The Board of Directors may change the location of the principle office and Headquarters of said corporation as required, for the best interest of the corporation.

The corporation shall have the right to have other offices established at other locations within or outside the United States of America as the Board may from time to time appoint or the business may require.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

This corporation is organized exclusively for the charitable purpose within the meaning of section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organization that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. More particularly, to conduct and establish charitable and social related programs and activities, for seniors and unprivileged; Establish Immediate Emergency Short Term Housing for youth and young adults, long Term Affordable Housing for Seniors, Secured Temporary Shelter Housing. Establish Food Banks, Clothing Banks, Transportation, Battered Shelters. The Overflow Outreach Missionary Support Center Incorporation shall minister to the needs of the people. All funds, whether income or principal, whether acquired by gifts or contribution or otherwise, shall be devoted to the said purpose.

At all times the following shall operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the corporation:

1. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof.

2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

4. The corporation shall not lend any of its assets to any officer or director of this corporation unless such loan program is regulated as part of the activities structured in the by laws, and the qualification of the individual to participate in the same is determined by panel comprised of non- Board members, or guarantee to any person the payment of a loan by an officer or director of this corporation.

5. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed by the Board of Directors to other charitable organizations under the section of 501©(3), or for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IV

THE MANNER OF ELECTION OR APPOINTMENT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The manner in which the Directors are elected or appointed: The Nominating Committee by the advice of the Advisory Board shall recommend qualified nominees in accordance with policies and principles set forth in the By Laws to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall elect or appoint, by a unanimous agreement, Directors submitted by the Nominating Committee.

The corporation may (but need not) have voting members. The management and affairs of the corporation shall be at all times under the direction of the Board of Directors, whose operations in governing the corporation shall be by statute and by the corporation by-laws. No Director shall have any right, title, or interest in or to any property of the corporation.

Further expounding of election or appointment for Board Directors shall be established in the by -laws of the corporation. The agenda of structure, responsibilities, and duties of the Board of Directors and other Officers and Committees shall be established within the OVERFLOW OUTREACH MISSIONARY SUPPORT CENTER Corporation By-laws.
