ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Article I

The name of this corporation shall be, "Royal Nation Ministries, Inc." It shall be incorporated as a not for profit religious organization under the laws of the State of Florida.

Article II

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be: 1007 W. 6th Street, in the city of Lakeland, FL 33805. The registered agent in charge therof is Sanford Brookins of 1007 W. 6th Street, Lakeland, FL 33805.

Article III

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

- 1. To encourage and promote the evangelization of the gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world.
- 2. To encourage and promote the worship of God
- 3. To encourage and promote the edification of believers
- 4. To provide a fellowship among Christians of like faith
- 5. To spread the gospel of Jesus Christ by utilizing the gifts of God's people through all communication medium such as public assembly; radio, T.V; church, CD's, DVD's, one-on-one, interne.
- 6. To help feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty, befriend strangers; clothe those in need, visit the sick and imprisoned.
- 7. To seek out individuals, groups, organizations and businesses that can provide spiritual, monetary or material support to help meet ministry objectives.
- 8. To celebrate being a follower of Jesus Christ.
- 9. To invest in fellow Christ followers.
- 10. To reward Christ followers.
- 11. To spread the gospel of Jesus Christ so others can become part of the "Royal Nation" of God.

Part V, 3a - Further Information

Sanford Brookins, CEO, CFO, Minister, Youth Pastor, Graduate Student at Strayer University, Tampa, FL; Earned Bachelor's degree in Church Ministries from Southeastern University in Lakeland, Florida (December 2006). Retired Navy Chief. Estimated 80 hours a month will be dedicated for Royal Nation Ministries, Inc as CEO/CFO. Overall responsible for the organization's mission being carried out and adherence to government guidelines.

School. Estimated 10 hours a month dedicated for Royal Nation Ministries. As Director of Development, she is in charge of finding the money that Royal Nation needs to carry on its mission.

Brenda Bettard, - Pharmaceutical Control Clerk, Lakeland, FL. Graduate of Kathleen High School. Estimated 10 hours a month dedicated for Royal Nation Ministries. As Administrative Assistant, she works directly with the CEO on administrative matters concerning Royal Nation Ministries.

Marcus Williams – Elementary school Coach, Tampa, FL. Earned Bachelor's degree from William Penn University. Estimated 10 hours a month dedicated for Royal Nation Ministries. As Program Manager, he is assigned a specific program to manage for Royal Nation Ministries. An example is being in charge of the food drive program.

Part V, 4a – 4g: Compensation Arrangements

This organization has adopted a conflict of interest policy that sets guidelines concerning the actions of Directors. See Part V Section 5a. Currently, no Director within the organization is receiving a salary compensation. The bylaws governing compensation arrangements are found in Article IV, sections 4 and 5.

Article I Purpose

The purpose of the conflict of interest policy is to protect this tax-exempt organization's (Royal Nation Ministries, Inc) interest when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of a director of the Organization or might result in a possible excess benefit transaction. This policy is intended to supplement but not replace any applicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations.

Article II Definitions

Interested Person
 Any director, principal officer, or member of a committee with governing board-delegated powers, who has a direct or indirect financial interest, as defined below, is an interested person.

If a person is an interested person with respect to any entity in the Royal Nation Ministry of which the organization is a part, he or she is an interested person with respect to all entities in the ministry.

2. Financial Interest

A person has a financial interest if the person has, directly or indirectly, through business, investment, or family: a. An ownership or investment interest in any entity with which the Organization has a transaction or arrangement,

b.A compensation arrangement with the Organization or with any entity or individual with which the Organization has a transaction or arrangement, or

c. A potential ownership or investment interest in, or compensation arrangement with, any entity or individual with which the Organization is negotiating a transaction or arrangement.

Compensation includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are not insubstantial.

A financial interest is not necessarily a conflict of interest. Under Article III, Section 2, a person who has a financial interest may have a conflict of interest only if the appropriate governing board or committee decides that a conflict of interest exists.

Article III

Procedures

- 1. Duty to Disclose In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the Royal Nation CEO and directors concerning the proposed transaction or arrangement.
- 2. Determining Whether a Conflict of Interest Exists
 After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, he/she shall leave the Royal Nation governing board meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists.
- 3. Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest
- a. An interested person may make a presentation at the governing board, but after the presentation, he/she shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest.
- b. The CEO shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.
- c. After exercising due diligence, the governing board shall determine whether the Organization can obtain with reasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest.
- d. If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the governing board shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested directors, whether the transaction or arrangement is in Royal Nation Ministries best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable. In conformity with the above determination, it shall make its decision as to whether to enter into the transaction or arrangement.
- 4. Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy
- a. If the governing board or committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.
- b. If, after hearing the member's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the governing board determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

Records of Proceedings

The minutes of the governing board and all committees with board-delegated powers shall contain:

- a. The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have a financial interest in connection with an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the financial interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of interest was present, and the governing board's or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed.
- b. The names of the persons who were present for discussions and votes relating to the transaction or arrangement, the content of the discussion, including any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement, and a record of any votes taken in connection with the proceedings.

Article V Compensation

- a. A voting member of the governing board who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from Royal Nation Ministries, Inc for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- b. A voting member of any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from Royal Nation Ministries, Inc for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- c. No voting member of the governing board or any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the Royal Nation Ministries, Inc, either individually or collectively, is prohibited from providing information to any committee regarding compensation.
- d. Ministers who receive compensation from Royal Nation Ministries, Inc, whether directly or indirectly or as employees or independent contractors, are precluded from membership on any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters. No person, either individually or collectively, is prohibited from providing information to any committee regarding ministry compensation.]

Article VI Annual Statements

Each director, principal officer, and member of a committee with governing board-delegated powers shall annually sign a statement, which affirms such person:

- a. Has received a copy of the conflicts of interest policy.
- b. Has read and understands the policy.
- c. Has agreed to comply with the policy, and

d.Understands the Organization is charitable and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption it must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes.

Article VII Periodic Reviews

To ensure that Royal Nation Ministries, Inc operate in a manner consistent with charitable purposes and does not engage in activities that could jeopardize its tax-exempt status, periodic reviews will be conducted. The periodic reviews shall, at a minimum, include the following:

subjects:

a. Whether compensation arrangements and benefits are reasonable, based on

a. Whether compensation arrangements and benefits are reasonable, based on competent survey information and the result of arm's length bargaining.

b. Whether partnerships, joint ventures, and arrangements with management organizations conform to the Royal Nation Ministries written policies, are properly recorded, reflect reasonable investment or payments for goods and services, further charitable purposes and do not result in inumment, impermissible private benefit or in an excess benefit transaction.

Article III Use of Outside Experts

When conducting the periodic reviews as provided for in Article VII, the Royal Nation Ministries, Inc may, but need not, use outside advisors. If outside experts are used, their use shall not relieve the governing board of its responsibility for ensuring periodic reviews are conducted.

Part VI, la - Benefits

The goods we plan to provide consist of food or clothing to disadvantaged members of the general public. They will be provided to the public free of charge.

The services we plan to provide consist of the services necessary to get the food and the clothes to the ones in need. These services will be provided free of charge. We also plan to provide the services of entertainment and of artistic education to members of the public-at-large. Charges for these benefits and services are at present undetermined, and while every attempt will be made to ensure that, they are provided free of charge, if they are not able to be so, the charge will be reasonable and related to the cost of the service to be provided.

Part VIII, 4a - Specific Fundraising Activities

Donations solicitations - the organization plans to use face-to-face public assembly and radio in order to solicit donations from interested donors of the general public. Foundation grant solicitations - the organization plans to solicit grants directly from nonprofit foundations that award grants based on the programs we will offer, and the charitable and educational work we do.

Accept website donations - the organization plans to accept donations on our website so that a diverse group of the public will have the opportunity to donate to the worthy causes we will be working for.

Government grant solicitations - the organization plans to solicit grants directly from the government and government agencies that award grants to organizations that do the charitable and educational work we do.

All funds raised will be used to further the tax-exempt purposes of this organization, through charitable and educational means.

Part VIII, 4b - Fundraising

This newly formed nonprofit has not entered into oral or written contracts with individuals or organizations for the raising of funds, and has no specific plans to do so in the foreseeable future.

Part VIII, 4d - Fundraising

We will fundraise for our own organization in the State of Florida, specifically Polk, County. At this point in time, the organization has no other plans to conduct fundraising in any other state or jurisdiction.

Part VIII, 11 - Other Contributions

This newly formed nonprofit has no current plans to accept the contributions mentioned in this question. If this organization does decide to accept these contributions in the future, they will be accepted solely in order to support the organization in its tax-exempt purposes.

Part IX, Financial Data

Line 23 – This is an approximate amount of the expenses that will be paid out to conduct our Royal Nation Talent events. We hope to pay all expenses for three (4) events in our first year at approximately \$200 in expenses per event. By our second and third years, we hope to have the funds to help meet the physical and spiritual needs of the Christian community and the general public.
