ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

FLORIDA STUDENT ATHLETES, INC.

(A Florida corporation not for profit)

The undersigned subscriber to these Articles of Incorporation, a natural person competent to contract, hereby forms a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, and hereby subscribes to and adopts the following as the articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE I: NAME AND MAILING ADDRESS

The name of this corporation is **FLORIDA STUDENT ATHLETES**, **INC**. and its mailing address shall be 7325 Satsuma Drive, Punta Gorda, Florida 33955.

ARTICLE II: DURATION

This corporation shall exist perpetually unless dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE III: PURPOSES

The purposes for which this corporation is organized are exclusively charitable and educational within the meaning of the United States Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

The membership of this corporation shall consist of the members of the Board of Directors as may hereafter be elected pursuant to the Bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE V: INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT

ARTICLE VI: SUBSCRIBER

ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, a vice-president, a secretary, a treasurer, and such other officers as may be provided in the Bylaws, all of whom shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the corporation at its annual meeting.

<u>Section 1</u>. The business affairs of this corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors. This corporation shall have three initial directors. The number of directors may be changed from time to time in accordance with the Bylaws, but shall never be less than three nor more than nine.

<u>Section 2</u>. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the corporation and shall hold office in accordance with the Bylaws.

ARTICLE IX: BYLAWS

The Board of Directors shall adopt such Bylaws for the conduct of its business and the carrying out of its purposes as it may deem necessary, and may from time to time amend, alter, or rescind the same by a simple majority vote of those present at a board meeting called for that purpose, or at a regular board meeting upon notice given, except as otherwise herein provided.

ARTICLE X: AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by a two-thirds vote of those present at a special meeting of the Board of Directors called for that purpose, or at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors upon notice given, as provided by the Bylaws, of intention to submit such amendments.

ARTICLE XI: DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE XII: INDEMNIFICATION

Every officer and director of this corporation shall be indemnified by the corporation against expenses and liabilities, including attorney's fees, reasonably incurred by or imposed on him or her in connection with a proceeding to which he or she is a party or in which he or she is involved because of being or having been a director or officer of this corporation, or a settlement of such proceeding, whether or not he or she is a director or officer at the time the expenses are incurred, unless he or she is adjudged guilty of wilful misfeasance or malfeasance in the performance of his or her duties; but if the settlement is made, the indemnification applies only when the Board of Directors approves the settlement and reimbursement as being in the best interest of the corporation. This indemnification is in addition to and not exclusive of other rights to which the directors or officers are entitled.

ARTICLE XIII: PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles of incorporation to the contrary, this corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under I.R.C. Section 501(c)(3) or by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under I.R.C. Section 170(c)(2) or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set

forth herein. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
