Articles of Incorporation

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
COMMUNITY BAPTIST MISSION, INC.

Article I

The name of this corporation is Community Baptist, Inc. The corporation may also be known by a shortened form of the above style, and may be represented by the shorter form to the public, to wit: Community Baptist Mission. Principle Place of Business is Article II ABOBSH LACEWALES F1, 33853

This corporation is a religious nonprofit and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Corporation Law of Florida. The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

- A. The specific purpose of this corporation is to further the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, and to engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be organized under the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law of Florida.
- B. The corporation goal is to provide counseling services, free feedings, free clothing and resources to the homeless and low-income families duce the love of God to all mankind.

Article III

The name and address in the State of Florida of this corporation's initial agent for service of process is: Rev. Alton Norwood 114 W Crystal Ave. Lake Wales Fl 33853 (Polk County Florida),

Article IV

- A. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code").

 Article V Director are appointed by the Owner
- B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- C. The property of the Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to nonprofit religious purposes. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of its directors, officers, or to any other individual, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and to make payments in the furtherance of the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation.
- D. Upon the winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the founder shall, after paying or adequately providing for all the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the

Corporation, distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation exclusively for the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation in such manner as the founder shall in its sole discretion determine, or shall distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation to such organization or organizations which are organized and operated exclusively for the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation and which are tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, as the founder in its sole discretion shall determine.

- E. In furtherance of its religious nonprofit tax-exempt purposes, the Corporation shall have the following powers and authority:
 - (a) To do all acts, including ordination of ministers of the Gospel, perform all functions, and carry on all activities permitted by the nonprofit corporation laws of the State of Florida or of any other State in which the Corporation is qualified
 - (b) To have and exercise all powers and rights enjoyed by corporations generally in the State of Florida, and in any State in which the Corporation is qualified to act, as long as the exercise of such powers is not specifically prohibited for nonprofit religious corporations or churches.
 - (c) To use all media, whether now known or hereafter discovered, including, but not limited to, print, television, and radio.
 - (d) To exercise such incidental powers as may reasonably be necessary to carry out the purposes for which the Corporation is established, provided that such incidental powers shall be exercised in a manner consistent with its tax-exempt status as a religious organization as set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.
 - (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws, the Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the nonprofit religious purposes of the Corporation, and the Corporation shall not carry on any activity not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or under the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law; or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under 170(b)(1)(A)(I) of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law.
