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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the corporation shall be **Love In Action International, Inc.**

ARTICLE TWO

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be 1206 W.STATE ROAD 436, ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, FL 32714

ARTICLE THREE

This corporation is organized exclusively for religious purposes, including; for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law).

No part of the net earning of the corporation shall insure to the benefit or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorize and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or any other corresponding provision of any future Federal Tax Code.

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purpose of the corporation, or for one or more other exempt purposes, in such manner, or to one or more organizations described in Sections 501 (c) (3) and 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provision of any future Federal Tax Code), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

- (a) To disseminate the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the Word of God, to the end that people may be evangelized and believers may be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ (Acts 13:47, Isaiah 6:8) to regularly assemble for fellowship to worship God in Spirit and in truth (Hebrews 10:25) and to cooperate in the building up of the whole body of Christ. (Ephesians 2:19-22)
- (b) To provide basic New Testament discipleship to all who are approved for this purpose by Elders. (Acts 6:7, 14:20-23)

- (c) To establish and maintain a church and to provide a place of public worship and prayer in accordance with the directions of the Holy Spirit, (1 Kings 8:28-29; Psalm 96:9) to spread the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ through the preaching and teaching of the Bible to bring the unsaved to Christ (Mark 6:15;Romans 1:15-16) and build up the saved in Christian grace and living. (Ephesians 4:11-16; Hebrews 3:1-4) Pursuant thereto, the following activities and guidelines shall be established:
- 1- A recognized statement of faith, Code of Doctrine, discipline and form of Worship shall be established.

(Acts 8:37;15:11,16:31; Romans 4:20-25)

- 2- A Biblical form of government shall be established. (Exodus 18; Ephesians 4:8-11)
- 3-Ordination of ministers upon completion of the prescribed course of study, designated by this church.
 - (1 Chronicles 9:22-23; Titus 1:5)
- 4- An organization of ministers shall be established to minister to the congregation Love in Action International. Colossians 4:17; Romans 16:1)
- 5-Establishment of a covenant fellowship based upon acceptance of and conformity to the belief of the church. (Acts 15:41, 16:5).
- 6-Propagate the word of the Gospel through seminars, the establishment of Church literature and other forms of mass media for the purpose of educating the individual in the Word of God. (Psalm 96:10; Proverbs 13:17).
- 7-Establishment of various religious services pursuant to the recognized Statement of Faith, form of worship, discipline of the church and the establishment of Sunday school and religious schools for Christian and educational instruction of children and adults to exalt the standard of Christian living and the divine leadership of our divine Lord and Master. (Proverbs 8:10;13:1; Zephaniah 3:7)
- 8-Establishment of a Bible Training School or School of Theology for the preparation of ministers who minister to **LOVE IN ACTION INTERNATIONAL, INC** and to ordain ministers and Christian workers to the edification and the unity of the body of Christ. (Psalm 40:9-10; John 14:26)
- (d) To send forth home and foreign missionaries to the spreading of the Gospel and in extending the Gospel of God throughout the world (Mark 16:15-16; Acts 13:47, 4:29-30).
- (e) To print, publish, and distribute and sell books, magazines and other literature in connection with the purposes of this corporation; to sell, record and reproduce tapes, radio, and television programs in connection with the purpose of this corporation to produce and distribute radio and television programs (Deuteronomy 31:19; I Chronicles 16:23-24; Psalm 68:4; Revelation 14:2).
- (f) To establish and maintain a counseling service for the use of the Church and public and to provide access to such counseling service by virtue of telephone communication (Proverbs 12:15:25:15:22; Jeremiah 49:20) to assist the body of Christ with employment and financial counseling including off-site Institute of Vocation (Job Training) (1 Corinthians 3:8; Colossians 4:1; Ecclesiastes 9:10) A Christian Human Service Group providing for the ministry through Family Services (Deuteronomy 15:7; Nehemiah 8:10).
- (g) To further all religious and charitable work and for such purposes to adopt and establish By-Laws, rules, regulations in accordance with the law and not inconsistent with this Articles of Incorporation. (Joshua 1:7-8, Habakkuk 2:2-3, Romans 7:12, 10:4).
- (h) To ordain ministers and Christian workers to the edification and the unity of the Body of Christ. (I Chronicles 9:22-23; Titus 1:5; I Corinthians 7:17; Acts 14:23).

(i) To carry on charitable work for:

After-care Center for Released Prisoners (Job 3:18; Psalm 69:33; Isaiah 49:9-10).

Sick and Shut-in-Ministry (James 5:14-15; Mark 16:18).

Unwed Mother's Home (Luke 1:39-40,56).

Abused Wives and Children's Home (Exodus 22:22-24; Deuteronomy 10:18; Acts 6:1; I Timothy 5:3-12,16).

Housing for the Homeless and Runaways (Leviticus 25:35; Proverbs 19:17; Luke 3:11; II Corinthians 8:14-15).

Care for and assist handicapped individuals (Leviticus 19:32; Isaiah 35:5; Mark 7:37; Luke 7:32, 14:13-14)

To provide ministry to homosexuals and prostitutes, so they may be taught the Gospel of Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 1:27-31, 6:9-11;

Hebrews 10:22; Luke 14:12-24; Matthew 22:2-10, John 8:1-11).

To provide homes for the aged (Leviticus 19:32; Psalm 71:9; Isaiah 45:20-22).

To provide child placement services and adoptive services (Psalm 127:3; Isaiah 54:1; Mark 10:14; Numbers 3:13).

To establish a credit union for members of the church (Psalm 72:4, 112:5; Malachi 3:10; Deuteronomy 15:7-11 28:12, 44; Matthew 5:42; Proverbs 3:9; Nehemiah 11:38). Housing for those with addictive behavior (Luke 4:18).

Drug and Alcohol Program (Isaiah 5:11, 19:14, 20; Habakkuk 2:15; Joel 2:32; Matthew 9:12; Psalm 121:2).

The mentally disturbed (Matthew 4:24, 17:15).

- (j) To provide food and clothing for those in need through direct grants and through discount stores whereby the needy may purchase food at reduced rates. (Acts 11:29 Psalms 72:13-13, 146:7; Isaiah 41;17; Matthew 25;35-40; Ezekiel 18:7,45:10-12; Deuteronomy 15:7-8, 25:13-16; James 2:15-65; Luke 3:11; Proverbs 11:1, 26; 16:11).
- (k) To provide homes for the aged (Leviticus 19:32; Psalms 71:9, Isaiah 45:20-22); to provide retirement homes for the faithful ministers and saints (Numbers 8:24-26; Zechariah 8:4); to care for the aged (Leviticus 19:32; Psalms 92:14, I Timothy 5:1,17), and to provide housing for the working staff of the church (Joshua 21:1-8, Acts 4:34-35).
- (I) To establish and maintain lending of books and tapes for members of the church who cannot afford to purchase the same (Psalm 68:11; Mark 14:7; Galatians 6:10; Mark 13:10; I Timothy 6:18; Romans 12:13).
- (m) To establish and maintain an educational institution not for pecuniary gain; for the establishment, maintenance and support of private Christian elementary and middle schools (Christian Academy), at which both charity and pay students shall be received; for the establishment, maintenance and support of a private Christian day care center and nursery school (Mark 10:14; Luke 18:16-17) at which both charity and pay students shall be received.
- (n) To establish and maintain a Christian bookstore for the benefit of the students and members of the Church and their guests (psalm 68:11; Acts 13:39).

- (o) To establish and raise up a ministry of arts including banners (Psalm 20:5, 60:4; Isaiah 13:2; Song of Solomon 2:4, 6:10), dance (Psalm 149:3, 150:4; Jeremiah 31:4), drama (Deuteronomy 11:7; Psalm 103:7, 106:2, 145:4, 11-12) and mime (Proverbs 10:19, 17:28; Ecclesiastes 9:17; Isaiah 30:15; Zephaniah 1:17).
- (p) To establish and raise up satellite churches and pastors to lead them, establish auxiliaries, clubs, and societies of a religious nature and to promote and encourage Christian fellowship between its members (Acts 15:41, 16:5).
- (q) To receive tithes, offering, and property by gift devise or bequest subject to the laws relating to the transfer of property by gift or will. (Acts 4:34-37; II Chronicles 31:3-7; Leviticus 27:30; I Corinthians 16:1-2; Luke 6:38).
- (r) To operate under the name as set forth in Article I above; to adopt and assume names in the furtherance of its nonprofit, tax-exempt purposes (Genesis 17:5, 32:28; Acts 13:9; Matthew 1:23; Revelation 2:17); to exercise such other incidental powers shall be exercised in a manner consistent with its tax exempt status as a religious organization as set forth in Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended, of the United States of America.

The several clauses contained in the Article shall be constructed both as purposes and powers and the statements contained in each clause, shall except where otherwise expressed, be in no wise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clauses, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers.

(s) To do all those things allowed and permitted under law and specifically those set forth in the FLORIDA Not-For-Profit Corporation Code.

ARTICLE FOUR

The manner in which the directors are elected is by the Board of Directors at its annual meeting. At each annual meeting of the Board for the election of Directors shall have the right to vote for as many nominees as there are vacancies on the Board of Directors. Voting for directors shall be by secret ballot, if called for by one or more of the Board members. A pre-printed ballot sheet shall not be necessary. The officers shall serve until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors, unless removed earlier in accordance with the By-Laws.

The general officers of the corporation shall be the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The principal duties of the President shall be to preside at all the meetings of the members of the Board of Directors and the general supervision of the ministry and corporation. He/she shall be the Chairman of the Board of Directors.

The principal duties of the Vice-President shall be to discharge the duties of the President in the event of the absence or disability, for any cause whatsoever, of the President.

The principal duties of the Secretary shall be to countersign all deeds, leases, and conveyances executed by the ministry, affix the seal thereto and to such other papers as shall be required or directed to be sealed, and to keep record of the proceedings of the Board of Directors, and to safely and systematically keep all books, papers, records, and documents belonging to the corporation, or in any way pertaining to the business thereof, except the books and records incidental to the duties of the Treasurer.

The principal duties of the Treasurer shall be to keep an account of all monies, credits and property of any and every nature of the corporation which shall come into his hands, and to keep an accurate account of all monies received and disbursed and of proper vouchers for monies disbursed and to render such accounts, statements, and inventories

and monies received and disbursed and of money and property on hand and generally of all matters pertaining to his office, as shall be required by the Board of Directors .

the Board of Directors may provide for the appointment of such additional officers as they may deem for the best interest of the corporation.

The officers shall perform such additional or different duties as shall from time to time be imposed or required by the Board of Directors, or as may be prescribed from time to time by the By-Laws.

DORA LIBREROS founder of this corporation, shall remain President until such time as he/she would desire to resign as President or Pastor, at which time he/she shall have the privilege of appointing the next President of the corporation.

ARTICLE FIVE

The corporation shall have a Board of Directors of no less than three (3) and no more than seven (7).

ARTICLE SIX

ARTICLE EIGHT

No member of **LOVE IN ACTION INTERNATIONAL INC**. shall be liable for its debts nor shall any members property be so liable.

ARTICLE NINE

The conditions and regulations of membership/fellowship and the rights and other privileges of membership/fellowship shall be determined by the By-Laws, with membership being eligible to all those who give evidence of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and who voluntarily subscribe to its tenants of faith and agree to be governed by its Constitution and By-Laws.

This corporation shall issue no stock, No part of the net earnings of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, directors, officers or other private persons except that this corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation. This corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political candidate for public office, including the publishing or distribution of statements.

ARTICLE TEN

The By-Laws of **LOVE IN ACTION INTERNATIONAL INC.** shall be adopted and amended by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE ELEVEN

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious and charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof, or to the benefit of any private individual.

ARTICLE TWELVE

Amendments to this Articles of incorporation, may be proposed by a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors. After notification to the members of the proposed amendment, such amendment shall be adopted by the Board of Directors by an affirmative vote of at least two thirds of the Directors present and voting at a meeting at which quorum is present.
