The undersigned has, for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation under the laws of Florida, adopted the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation shall be: UMUNNA COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purposes for which this corporation is organized include:

- To under this association as brothers and sisters, with a common task of bringing the Igbo people here in Florida together in unity.
- To promote progress and to educate the public about Igbo Culture.
- To assist each member in times of sickness, job search, loss of a family member and the community during disasters.
- To educate, promote, protect, advance and strengthen our rich cultural heritage and civilization in the state of Florida and beyond.

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• To engage and promote after school activities for the kids.

- To enhance and promote education by awarding scholarships to qualified students in the community.
- To promote harmony and peaceful co-existence with other ethnic groups.
- To promote mutual understanding between Igbos and people of other cultures

Specifically, Umunna Community Association Foundation, Inc. is organized exclusively for Charitable and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organization under section 501(c) (3) of internal revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, Trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on

- a. By an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- b. By an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the internal Revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code

Upon the dissolution of this corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the court of common pleas of the county in which the

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principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization(s), as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
