The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a nonprofit Corporation under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes, Chapter 617, makes and adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the Corporation is as follows: ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc.

ARTICLE II

Principal Office

The principal place of business and mailing address of the corporation is 3531 NW 43rd Place, Lauderdale Lakes, FL 33309.

ARTICLE III

Purposes

The primary objective of ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. is to provide community-based social services to the children of Broward County. ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. is a youth diversion program designed to divert or channel out youthful offenders from the juvenile justice system. ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. ameliorates the problem of overburdened juvenile courts and overcrowded corrections (including detention facilities) so that courts and institutions can focus on more serious offenders. ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. allows juvenile offenders an opportunity to correct their decision-making process and behavior.

ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The Corporation may receive and administer funds for religious, educational, and charitable purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and to that end, ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. is empowered to hold any property, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value; to dispose of any such property and to invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal or the income in such a manner as, in the judgment of the directors, will best promote the purposes of ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. without limitation, except limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, these Articles of Incorporation, the By-Laws of ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., or any applicable laws, do any other act or thing incidental to or connected with the foregoing purposes or in advancement thereof,

but not for the pecuniary profit or financial gain of its directors or officers except as permitted under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.

No part of the net earnings of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, officer of the Alternative Sentencing Adolescent Program, Inc., or any private individual, except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. affecting one or more of its purposes, and no member, trustee, officer of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc.

No substantial part of the activities of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation, and the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. shall not participate in or intervene in, including the publication or distribution of statements, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE IV

Dissolution

On the dissolution of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., distribute all of the assets of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes in such manner and to such qualified organization or organizations as the board of directors shall determine. Any of the assets not so distributed shall be distributed in accordance with the direction of any court having jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc. is then located, exclusively for the above purposes of the ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING ADOLESCENT PROGRAM, Inc., or to a qualified organization or organizations as the court shall determine. For purposes of this article, an organization is a "qualified organization" only if, at the time of receiving the assets, it is operated exclusively for the purposes described in 26 U.S.C.A. § 170(c)(1) and is described in 26 U.S.C.A. § 509(a)(1), (2) or (3). Elections for officers shall be held during the month of September of each year to elect officers for the upcoming year. Nominations shall be taken one week before the election is held. Officers shall be elected by a majority of the membership present on the day that the election is held.

ARTICLE V

Manner of Election of Directors

The method of elections of Directors shall be stated in the By-Laws of the Corporation.
