

Florida Community Alliance, Inc. - Specific Purpose

Florida Community Alliance, Inc. ("FCA") is a 501(3)(c) nonprofit corporation servicing youth and families residing in Palm Beach County and Martin County in Florida since February of 2009. Our mission has been to provide opportunities for positive interaction between youth offenders and law enforcement by utilizing cross-age mentoring and leadership training to encourage citizenship, accountability and respect for family and neighbor. As a collaborative with law enforcement, juvenile justice, mental health agencies, local community business', aftercare, educational, and faith-based establishments, Florida Community Alliance, Inc.'s L.E.T.'S Pass It Forward Project embraces the philosophy of "being my brother's keeper" by implementing a two-prong method for approaching criminal behavior. This assigns prevention tasks to referred youths as an objective required during subjective intervention practices.

Florida Community Alliance, Inc. was organized as a direct response to the Attorney General's report encouraging law enforcement to collaborate with community service agencies, as a united effort moving toward reducing violent crimes incidences in gang-inhabited communities, nationwide. Gang and youth survey trends demonstrate that vital areas in adolescent development have been negatively affected by the influences of misguided gang affiliates. These include legal involvement, low educational attainment, increase in use of illegal substances, unemployment, dismembered interpersonal relationships and violence related fatalities. Florida Community Alliance, Inc. assumes a strength based perspective. It engages the "unrealized qualities" of gang youth as survivors, entrepreneurs, team players, loyalists, advocates, recruiters, and charismatic leaders able to exert bold influence and commit to a cause and utilizes them as viable instruments in instigating a solution.

Studies show that the greater the individual, familial and community risk factors endured by youth, the greater the predisposition to gang affiliation. Palm Beach County, Florida, has 1,500 named gangs with an estimated membership of 65,000. The 2008 Palm Beach County Youth Survey reported community disorganization, lack of neighborhood attachment, poor family management, lack of commitment to school, favorable attitudes toward antisocial behavior, and excessive transition/mobility in families as risk factors more prevalent in Palm Beach County than the reported national norm. With more gang members than law enforcement, the L.E.T.'S Pass It Forward project aims to tilt the numbers in favor of justice. The project utilizes law enforcement as trained mentors teaching and modeling strategies to youth offenders. "Ideal" peer mentors, such as Boy Scouts and ROTC, serve as support buffers that accelerate rapport building between law enforcement and program participants throughout the rehabilitative process. Youth offenders are trained and held responsible for educating and modeling positive behaviors for at risk youth, whose caretaker(s) have been incarcerated. By program design, all participants are encouraged to interact and assist law enforcement officers with initiatives that foster improved conditions within the community infrastructure. L.E.T.'S Pass It Forward offers psychoeducational groups, community excursions, professional workshops, community education, employment and fundraising opportunities developed to promote success and sustainability of accomplishment. Our 75% volunteer-based staff are screened, selected, and trained to identify participant's individual strengths and help them to build resiliency throughout program membership. Florida Community Alliance, Inc. A.S.P.I.R.RE's (Assess, Screen, Prevention, Intervention, Rehabilitation & Re-Entry) to invoke change in behavioral patterns that replace old unhealthy ones.

Existing programs are designed to ameliorate the undesirable behaviors of targeted youths, but often fail to explore, and offer solace to the stressors that precipitate these behaviors. The L.E.T.'S Pass It Forward Project is designed to assess for stressors and strengths alike when planning for successful attainment of cognitive transformation. As victims of trauma, gang associated youth are empowered by licensed and masters level mental health professionals with skills that invite healthy processing of life experiences in a safe environment. While not all participants require completion of every phase or program component, as a comprehensive approach to rehabilitation, L.E.T.'s, an acronym for Law Enforcement Teaching Strategies, as a comprehensive approach to rehabilitation, recommends enrollment in all aspects of program, to increase participant's opportunities of achieving maximum success. Youth graduating from program after completing Lead Training I, II, III, Workskills, and Job

Training Placement will receive a certificate of completion, a business suit for interviewing, job ready binder (includes completed resume, letter of recommendation from business mentor, letters of support from law enforcement mentor, Certificate of CPR and First Aid training), 50-100 completed community service hours, GED/academic support, aftercare support groups and sustainable skills not limited to effective communication, problem solving techniques, stress reduction skills, decision making capability, improved positive interaction with law enforcement, community businesses, school authority, and family as a support system.
