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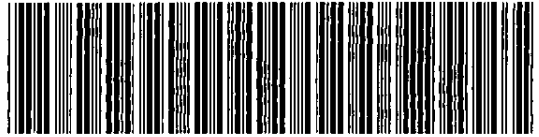

**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SAMARITAN HOPE CENTER, INC.**

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The undersigned acting as incorporators of a corporation pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation.

**ARTICLE I
NAME**

The name of the corporation shall be called Samaritan Hope Center, Inc.

**ARTICLE II
PRINCIPAL OFFICE**

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be 708 NW 9th Ct., Hallandale, Florida, 33009.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

A) Community Multipurpose Social Service Center

To establish and maintain a faith-based multi-purpose social service organization in the State of Florida. To establish and conduct community-based social and support services for children and families. To that end, the corporation may adopt and establish By-Laws, and make all rules and regulations deemed necessary and expedient for the management of its affairs, in accordance with law and consistent with these articles of incorporation; and, to take and manage, hold and dispose of the property, real and personal to the corporation.

B) Family Empowerment and Spiritual Enhancement

To provide and maintain a place of help that benefits the poor and needy by ministering to their needs and necessities; by assisting them to establish themselves by bringing their needs and hearts under the influence of education and Christian doctrines; and, to carry on every kind of work necessary and incidental to the maintenance of such

religious, educational, charitable and philanthropic work; and that all such work shall be conducted by this corporation not for pecuniary profit.

C) Program Development

For the accomplishment of the objectives and purposes of this corporation, it has power to establish programs; to print, publish, bind and distribute such books, magazines, papers and other literature as will further carry out the objectives of this corporation; to lease suitable buildings and equipment, and to acquire by purchase or gifts such personal and real property as may be necessary to carry out the objectives of this corporation; and to receive subscriptions and donations of real and personal property to be applied to the uses and purposes of this corporation, and to execute such trusts; to mortgage or use otherwise encumber any of its property, for religious, educational, benevolent, or other lawful purposes. The corporation shall have the power to organize, conduct and supervise programs throughout Florida and shall be subject to and under the control of this corporation.

D) Publications and Donations

To publish and disseminate faith-based newspapers, books, tracts and the like, and to obtain funds by gifts, donations, grants, collect bequests and otherwise for the purposes of the corporation.

**ARTICLE IV
MANNER OF ELECTION**

The management of this corporation shall be vested in a board of directors of not less than three directors as provided in the By-Laws, which shall organize committees, departments and programs, and shall have supervision of all work of the corporation and shall make all contracts and leases, and have all such other powers as are conferred by and the By-Laws.

The method of election, term of office of directors, guidelines regarding removal of an officer and how to fill vacancies shall be as stated in the By-Laws of this corporation.

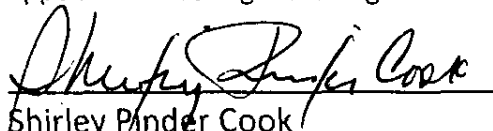

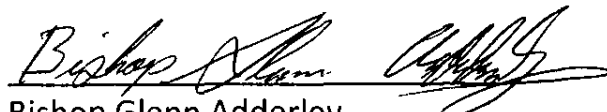
