Exhibit A to Articles of Incorporation of The ARC Project, Inc.

ARTICLE III. The Corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific and educational purposes (collectively, "Charitable Purposes") within the meaning of Sections 170(c)(2)(B) and 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), including, but not limited to the making of distributions for Charitable Purposes. Within the scope of such purpose and meaning, the Corporation may:

- (a) Make contributions to any organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code;
- (b) Expend its funds directly to accomplish one or more purposes described in Sections 170(c)(1) and 170(c)(2)(B) of the Code;
- (c) Receive by way of gift, devise, hequest, or otherwise, money or other property without limitation as to amount or value and hold, sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of the same; to invest and reinvest both principal and income, or both, in such manner as the Board of Directors may deem wise and without limitation to those securities which by law are or may be authorized as trust investments; and to apply and distribute the income, and, except to the extent limited by any specific gift, devise or bequest of property or funds, the principal, in such manner as the board of directors may deem best for the promotion of any or all of its corporate purposes; and
- (d) Engage in any and all lawful activities necessary for, or incidental to, the foregoing purposes.

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles of Incorporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE VIII. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation in furtherance of the charitable, educational, and scientific purposes of the Corporation, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, as the Board of Directors shall determine.
