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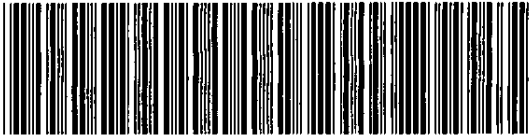

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
THE LEARNING PAGE, INC.

The undersigned Incorporator of these Articles of Incorporation is a natural persons competent to contract and hereby forms a corporation under the Florida Not for Profit Corporations Act.

ARTICLE I. NAME AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The name of this corporation is The Learning Page, Inc. and its principal office is located at 3938 Sunbeam Road #2, Jacksonville, Florida 32257.

ARTICLE II. DURATION

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE III. PURPOSE

This corporation is organized to instruct and train individuals for the purpose of improving or developing their capabilities and to instruct the public on subjects useful to individuals and beneficial to the community.

ARTICLE IV. INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 7400 Baymeadows Way #106, Jacksonville, Florida 32256 and the name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Robert Wallace. The stockholders shall have the power to establish branch offices, and to move the principal office to any other address in Florida.

ARTICLE V. INCORPORATOR

ARTICLE VI. MANNER OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

A Board of Directors shall consist of two or more individuals with the number fixed in accordance with the bylaws. The initial directors shall be Susan Zenick and Joseph P. Vickers. Directors shall be elected or appointed in the manner and for the terms

provided in the bylaws.

ARTICLE VII. OFFICERS

The initial officers of the corporation who shall hold office for the ensuing year until their respective successors are chosen and qualify are:

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENT

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in the manner provided by law.

ARTICLE IX. EXCLUSIVE PURPOSE

The purpose for which the organization is organized are exclusively religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

ARTICLE X. EXCLUSIVE BENEFIT

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributions of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

ARTICLE XI. DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed to one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provisions of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the

principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
