Articles of Incorporation of <u>ALPHA WORLD MISSION INC.</u>, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Corporation under the Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of Florida, do hereby certify:

Article 1: The name of the Corporation shall be ALPHA WORLD MISSION INC.

Article II: The principal address in this state where the principal office of the Corporation is to be located is <u>9 Palm Harbor Village Way Unit A</u> city of <u>Palm Coast</u>, <u>FL 32317 Flagger County</u>.

Article III: Said Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The main purpose for which this corporation is organized is to receive cash and non cash contributions such as clothing, household appliances on behalf of the community and in some specific cases to assist people and Christian organizations in other countries. The organization shall distribute and sell clothing, and household appliances at reduced prices to persons of low income and or donate items to persons in need of economic assistance. The funds collected by the organization shall be used to purchase items at reduced auctioned, garage sales or salvage prices to be resold to raise funds to finance the establishment of Christian churches and schools in the USA and abroad, to support missionaries, camps and academic institutions to promote the Christian falth, to conduct examinations to license candidates for Christian ministries, to provide Christian counseling services to organizations and individuals, to endorse missionary programs in the USA and abroad, and to compensate the organization managers and workers required to support the organization activities.

Article IV: The Directors shall be elected according to the corporation bylaws.

Article VII: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 107(c) (2) of the internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article VIII: Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes with the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purposes. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court Of Competent Jurisdiction in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
