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

PART IV CORPORATE PURPOSE

Miry Clay Mini. rries, Inc ("Miry Clay") was founded in 2010. Its mission is to support, empower, and reintegrate ex offender: in the community, who have demonstrated a desire and commitment to a faith based life. In providing positive reinforcement and a structured faith based reentry housing environment, the opportunity for long term success becomes tangible and recidivism less likely. Miry Clay will bridge the gap called "appropriate housing", and set a standard for the renovation of an ex offender's life. Structured reentry housing focused in reinforcing and encouraging continued spiritual growth is a solid foundation for which successful reintegration can be built on.

Through providing a structured faith based residential environment ex offenders who reenter society with no reasonable chance of succeeding will possess a vital element to enable them to reach the finish line of the transition process. Initially Miry Clay will provide the following elements of a successful faith based lifestyle: a place to call "home"; an established address; initial immediate needs such as food and clothing; transportation; pro bono dental collaborative network; financial guidance; employment guidance; mentoring; encouragement; spiritual training; regular structure of bible studies, prayer, and church services; and integration into a local church fellowship. Its long term objective is to demonstrate viable models with revenue producing employment training programs, further developed networking groups to provide such services as pro bono legal, financial, and medical, and an ex offender property acquisition program. Miry Clay will establish faith based housing ministry opportunities across the country, renovating and transforming the lives of ex offenders, and their communities.

CONFLICT OF INTREST POLICY

Article I

Purpose

The purpose of the conflict of interest policy is to protect this tax-exempt organization's (Organization) interest when it is contemplating entering in to a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of an officer or director of the Organization or might result in a possible excess benefit transaction. This policy is intended to supplement but not replace anyapplicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations.

Article II Definitions

1. Interested Person

Any director, principal officer, or member of a committee with governing board delegated powers, who has a direct or indirectfinancial interest, as defined below, is an interested person.

2. Financial Interest

A person has a financial interest if the person has, directly or indirectly, through business, investment, or family:

- a. An ownership or investment interest in any entity with which the Organization has a transaction or arrangement,
- b. A compensation arrangement with the Organization or with any entity or individual with which the Organization has atransaction or arrangement or
- c. A potential ownership or investment interest in, or compensation arrangement with, any entity or individual with which theOrganization is negotiating a transaction or arrangement.

Compensation includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are not insubstantial.

A financial interest is not ne- essarily a conflict of interest. Under Article III, Section 2, a person who has a financial interest may have

a conflict of interest only if the appropriate governing board or committee decides that a conflict of interest exists,

Article III

Procedures

1. Duty to Disclose

In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the directors and members of committees with governing boarddelegated powers considering the proposed transaction or arrangement.

2. Determining Whether a Conflict of Interest Exists

After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, he/she shall leave the governing board or committee meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board or committee members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists.

3. Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest

- a. An interested person may make a presentation at the governing board or committee meeting, but after the presentation, he/sheshall losve the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest.
- **b.** The chairperson of the go reming board or committee shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.
- c. After exercising due diligence, the governing board or committee shall determine whether the Organization can obtain withreasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest.
- d. If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the governing board or committee shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested
