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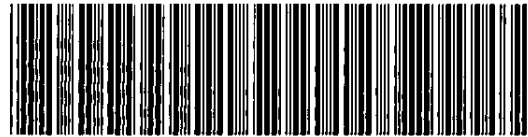

ARTICLE I NAME

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

Section 1 - To fill the gap of insufficient housing for male and female veterans and veterans with children.
Section 2 - To provide a stable and safe environment; case management; mental health and substance abuse counseling; (PTSD) post traumatic stress disorder; (TBI) traumatic brain injury, implement reintegration and readjustment programs for homeless veterans.
Section 3 - To establish a child care program for veterans receiving regular and intensive mental health care services.
Section 4 - To provide a post delivery health care for a newborn child of a female veteran.
Section 5 - To train caregivers for assistance and support for the family members and other qualified persons for eligible veterans.
Section 6 - To provide outreach collaboration with agencies providing work study programs and job training opportunities to lead to gainful employment.

ARTICLE VIII – PROVISIONS FOR TAX EXEMPTION

Section 1 – The purposes for which the organization are exclusively religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational with the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

Section 2 – Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

Section 3 – Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future Federal Tax Code, or shall be distributed to the Federal, State or Local Government for a public purpose. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas, of the county which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purpose.
