ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

<u>OF</u>

THE SANTA ROSA COUNTY VETERAN'S MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be THE SANTA ROSA COUNTY VETERAN'S MEMORIAL FOUNDATION, INC.,

ARTICLE II

CORPORATE NATURE

This is a nonprofit corporation, organized solely for charitable and educational purposes pursuant to the Florida Corporations Not for Profit law set forth in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes.

ARTICLE III

DURATION

The term of existence of the corporation is perpetual commencing on October 1, 2010.

ARTICLE IV

GENERAL AND SPECIFIC PURPOSES

The general and specific purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

To assist disabled veterans and promotion of the Santa Rosa County Veteran's Memorial.

ARTICLE V

MANAGEMENT OF CORPORATE AFFAIRS

A. <u>BOARD OF TRUSTEES</u>. The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its properties controlled, and its affairs conducted by a Board of Trustees. The number of trustees of the corporation shall not be less than three (3), nor more than fifteen (15), as determined at the

B. <u>CORPORATE OFFICERS</u>. The Board of Trustees shall elect the following officers: President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, and such other officers as the Bylaws of this corporation may authorize the Trustees to elect from time to time. Officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE VI

EARNINGS AND ACTIVITIES OF CORPORATION

- A. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV hereof.
- B. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- C. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal

Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

D. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degrees, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as such Court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VIII

MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Any friend of veterans, 18 years or over, who will endeavor to further the purpose for which this corporation is formed, may become a member of the corporation provided the application of such person is first approved by the Board of Trustees. The rules and regulations the Board of Trustees may adopt regarding eligibility for membership shall not discriminate on

the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, religion, sex or age. Members shall pay dues annually in an amount determined by the Bylaws. The Members of this corporation shall have no right, title or interest whatsoever in its income, property, or assets, nor shall any portion of such income, property, or assets be distributed to any member on the dissolution or winding up of this corporation. Members of this corporation shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities, or obligations of the corporation, and shall not be subject to any assessments, other than the annual dues as provided for in the Bylaws.
