#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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#### ARTICLE I NAME

## ARTICLE II PRINCIPAL OFFICE

### ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

- a) to establish a permanent organization that will further develop a common bond existing between all who have served with any airborne division and/or other units
- b) to maintain records and publish the history and achievements of the United States Paratroopers Port Charlotte Chapter, Inc.
- c) to perpetuate the memory of the members of any and all airborne units who have sacrificed their lives in the service of their country

#### <u>ARTICLE IV MANNER OF ELECTION</u>

The manner in which the directors are elected and appointed:

At least thirty days before the election the Commander shall announce the nominees in alphabetical order. On the day fixed for the election, a ballot listing the names of the nominees will be generally distributed and the members may cast their vote. The General Secretary shall tally the votes; promptly announce the winning candidates; file the vote in the records of the Chapter. If there are no more nominees than offices to be filled, the above formalities shall be dispensed with and the Commander shall notify the Chapter membership the nominees declared elected.
