

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SENIORS HISPANIC COALITION, CORPORATION



1. The name of the Corporation is as follows:

3. The purposes of the Corporation is as follows:

The Corporation is incorporated as a nonprofit corporation, organized for charitable, humanitarian, educational, cultural, health, and scientific purposes, an any other related or corresponding charitable purposes by the distribution of funds for said purposes, pursuant to the Florida Corporation Not for Profit Law set forth in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes and within the scope of Section 501 (c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

In furtherance of these purposes, the Corporation may exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida upon nonprofit Corporations

3. The Corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit, incident or otherwise. No part of the net earning of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director or officer of the Corporation or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for service rendered to or officer of the Corporation effecting one or more purposes), and no director or officer of the Corporation, or any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
