FOR

U.S. FORCES FUND, INC., A PUBLIC CHARITY,

BY

TRANSFER OF ASSETS TO PUBLIC CHARITY

U.S. FORCES FUND, INC., a Florida Non Profit Corporation and Public Charity under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, with Federal Tax Identification # 27-4826379 ("U.S. FORCES FUND"), wishes to terminate its status as a public charity by transferring all of its right, title, and interest in and to all of its net assets to a specific public charity.

Explanation of Termination

U.S. FORCES FUND is a small public charity and it has determined that the continued operation of U.S. FORCES FUND is no longer feasible, and therefore U.S. FORCES FUND wishes to dissolve under Florida state law following a distribution of all its assets to a qualified public charity.

Permissible Distributee

U.S. FORCES FUND will distribute all of its net assets to:

WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT, INC. a Florida not for profit corporation ("WOUNDED WARRIOR"), with a physical address at 4899 Belfort Road, No. 300, Jacksonville, Florida 32256 and web address http://www.woundedwarriotproject.org/. WOUNDED WARRIOR has a federal tax identification number of 20-2370934. See Exhibit A attached hereto for further detail regarding Wounded Warrior.

WOUNDED WARRIOR is a 501(c)(3) organization with a public charity (non-private foundation) status, and an organization described in § 170(b)(1)(A) which has been in existence

and so described for a continuous period of at least 60 calendar months immediately preceding such distribution.

WOUNDED WARRIOR is qualified to receive assets from the terminating charity as it has received a ruling from the IRS on its exempt status. See Exhibit B attached hereto for a copy of the IRS Ruling. U.S. FORCES FUND has taken all reasonable precautions to insure that its reliance upon WOUNDED WARRIOR's ruling is justified.

Conditions on Transfer

U.S. FORCES FUND will not impose any material restriction or condition that prevents the transferee public charity from freely and effectively employing the transferred assets or the income derived therefrom, in furtherance of its exempt purposes. U.S. FORCES FUND will receive no private benefit from such transfer.

Following the transfer:

- (a) WOUNDED WARRIOR will be the owner in fee of the assets;
- (b) WOUNDED WARRIOR will holds and administer the assets in a mariner consistent with its own exempt purposes;
- (c) the governing body of WOUNDED WARRIOR will have ultimate authority and control over the assets and the income derived from the assets; and
- (d) the governing body of WOUNDED WARRIOR will remain independent of U.S. FORCES FUND.

Filing Requirements

For the short tax year in which U.S. FORCES FUND is fully liquidated, dissolved, and terminated, U.S. FORCES FUND will file a final Form 990 in the year of its termination. U.S. FORCES FUND will file the final form four months and 15 days after the date of the final asset distribution and termination, or as such deadline may be extended. Schedule N. Liquidation,

Termination. Dissolution, or Significant Dispositions of Assets, will be included in the final Form 990.

U.S. FORCES FUND will include the following information in the final return:

- A certified copy of this Explanation and Plan of Termination and accompanying resolution;
- A list of the names and addresses of all recipients of assets, See <u>Exhibit A</u> and <u>Exhibit B</u>;

- An explanation of the nature and fair market value of assets distributed to each recipient. The entire corpus of U.S. FORCES FUND is approximately \$12,349.81 in the Fifth Third Bank account, all of which will be distributed to The Wounded Warriors Project, Inc. (EIN: 20-2370934).

State Termination

Upon the completion of the distribution, U.S. FORCES FUND's tax-exempt status as well as its public charity status will terminate. U.S. FORCES PUND will not remain in existence and will file the necessary corporate dissolution documents with the Florida Department of State.


