The undersigned subscriber to these Articles of Incorporation is a person competent to contract and hereby forms a non profit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I - CORPORATE NAME

The name of the corporation is HEAT SEEKERS OF HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, INC.

ARTICLE II - DURATION

This corporation shall exist perpetually unless dissolved according to Florida Law.

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

Officers

- 1. Number, Tenure Qualifications. The official Staff of the Corporation shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, & Treasurer,, and such other officers and assistant officers as directed by the President.
- 2. General power. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board (referred to in the Articles of incorporation as Official Staff), which shall exercise all of the powers of the Corporation and so all such lawful acts and things as required or permitted to be done by such a Board by law, the Articles of incorporation or these By-Laws.
- 3. Tenure, Qualifications, and appointments. The Official Staff shall meet the qualifications set forth in the applicable Florida Statues and who are willing to assist the Corporation in time, talent, and/or contributions. Each officer shall hold office for as long as they are willing to serve, unless they a) dies, b) resigns, c) removed, or d) fails to attend 75% of the scheduled meetings within a twelve month period, in which case the vacant office shall immediately be filled and should continue until reasons a, b, c, or d is violated.

- 4. Removal. The official Staff, whenever, in its judgment and the best interest of the Corporation, will be served thereby may remove any officer appointed by the President. A vote of 60% of the officers present requesting the officer in questioned to be removed. The officer removed will receive a letter via United States Postmaster stating reason for removal, and effective removal date.
- 5. Vacancies. A vacancy of any officer because of death, resignation, or removal may be appointed by the President or at the recommendation of the Board of Directors and the Official Staff in good standing.

6. Duties of the officers

- a. The President shall be the principal officer of the Corporation, shall preside at all meetings of the officers. In the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's death, or inability to act, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) for any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities, or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE XII - DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, at the discretion of the Official Staff, assets stall be distributed to one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c). (3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to the state or local government, for a public purpose. If necessary, a court shall dispose of any such assets not so disposed of competent jurisdiction of Hillsborough County, or the county in which the Principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
