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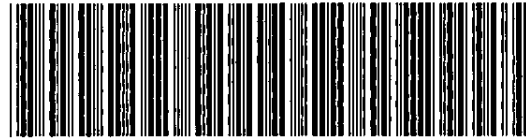

## Articles of Incorporation

of

Original Youth Ministry Foundation, Inc.

The following Articles of Incorporation are adopted for the Original Youth Ministry Foundation, Inc.

### Article I

The name of this corporation shall be Original Youth Ministry Foundation, Inc. This corporation is a non-profitable stock one, no dividend to be paid, under the law of the State of Florida. This corporation is created to exist perpetually commencing of the day filing Articles of Incorporation with the State of Florida.

### Article II Purposes

This corporation is organized to vision a greater place for the youth in life to balance concepts. To offer the opportunity to provide the youth with an education and hope for a future of success solution to high crime rates, high drop outs rates, fight against poverty and academic failure. To reduce hostility, guilt and shame from juvenile delinquency. To promote peace and integrity by having a born again mentor pointing individuals towards Jesus-Christ the ultimate solution to the youth dying world.

### Article III Objectives

The objectives are to save and sensitize youth environment. To teach the word of God, in a meaningful spiritual value. To advocate for the abandoned, neglected, abused, HIV/AIDS infected and affected children and drug exposed, and to fight teen pregnancy. To inform youth their rights and responsibilities with respect to local, state, federal, private and commercial agencies. To provide a broadcasting program to carry out all variety of services available through this foundation and other related ones. Manage programs and offer services to increase public safety to prevent juvenile delinquency in association with law enforcement, church, school, communities and other agencies to raise up responsible citizens.

### Article IV

The Foundation shall spread its mission by all legal permissible means to reach its goals such as: magazine, news-letter, concert, workshop, event, lectures, to enhance the awareness and knowledge concerning the above objectives.

### Article V

The Corporation shall have full power and authority to own, fund, maintain a scientific and educational organization. The Corporation shall solicit, receive, and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both and subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth.

### Article VI

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The Corporation shall engage in financing through lawfully means such as: church collection, sale of recordings events or various activities, community participants, gifts, legacies, grants, and initial amount set aside at the formation of the foundation, any legal profitable business, support from other agencies and foundations, income from activities organized by the foundation. Perform all acts to do whatever is deemed necessary, useful, advisable, directly or indirectly to complete the purposes of the Corporation as set forth in these Articles of Incorporation.

#### Article VII Exemption

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall constitute the carrying on of a propaganda to influence legislation. The Corporation shall not participate in any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to any candidate for public office. No income or profit shall inure to the benefit of members, trustees, officers, or other private persons. The Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purpose set forth in the purposes clauses hereof.

#### Article VIII Board members

The Corporation shall have members to its different boards and committees as stated in the Foundation bylaws. The management of the affairs of the foundation shall be vested in a Board of Directors that shall consist of seven or more members: a President, a Senior Vice-President, an Executive Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant-Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Church Council member, an Advisory member.

#### Article IX Personality

The Board of Directors shall not have any right, title, or interest in or to any property of the Corporation. No Director of the Foundation shall personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for breach of any duty as Director, not to the extent of violation for acts or omissions which involve intentional misconduct.

#### Article X Election

Board of Directors shall serve until the first annual meeting as initial members then shall go to the process of election for four years or removed and replaced by their elected successors as described in the bylaws.

#### Article XI Dissolution

All resolutions included dissolution of the Corporation shall be adopted in a meeting in which more than one third of the Board members is present as stated in the bylaws.
