ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF THE RED TENT WOMEN'S INITIATIVE INCORPORATED STATES AND MONPROFIT CORPORATION

Under the provisions of F.S. 617.1006, this corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation:

FIRST: Amendment adopted:

Article III of the Articles of Incorporation is amended to state:

The organization is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or any corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Specifically, the corporation is organized for the charitable and educational purposes of providing services to improve the lives of incarcerated and formerly incarcerated women. Such services include mentoring, financial empowerment and education, and social bonding, inside jail and in the community, in an atmosphere of trust and encouragement.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustee, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or by the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempt to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any other activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or by the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, of (b) by a corporation, contributions to

which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or by the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

SECOND: Amendment adopted:

Article VIII is added to the Articles of Incorporation and it states:

Upon the dissolution of this organization, any corporate assets remaining after the payment or discharge of all corporate liabilities, the return, transfer, or conveyances of assets held on conditions requiring the same, and the transfer or conveyance of assets received and held subject to limitations permitting their use only for charitable, religious, educational, or scientific or other similar purposes shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government for a public purpose.

THIRD: Adoption of Amendments:

There are no members entitled to vote and the amendments were adopted by the Board of Directors on September 2018.
