ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

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FBI TALLAHASSEE CITIZENS ACADEMY ALUMNI ASSOCIATION LINE ORIDE

The undersigned subscribe to these Articles of Incorporation pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit and further state as follows:

ARTICLE I Name and Principal Place of Business

The name of the corporation is the "FBI Tallahassee Citizens Academy Alumni Association, Inc." The initial principal place of business is: 131 North Gadsden Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32301.

ARTICLE II Duration

The period of the duration of this corporation shall be perpetual unless dissolved in accordance with Florida law. Corporate existence shall commence upon filing with the Secretary of State.

ARTICLE III Purpose

This corporation is organized as a charitable, educational and research organization within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this organization shall not carry on any activities which are not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3)

of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law. The corporation is established for the following specific purposes:

- 1. To provide the Tallahassee Regional Office of the FBI with volunteer and other support for the conduct of its community outreach programs, including, but not limited to, the conduct of future Citizens Academies in the Tallahassee area;
- 2. To promote a safer community through community service projects and education programs publicizing the mission, resources and priorities of the FBI;
- To provide a core organization for Alumni of the FBI Citizens Academy in the Tallahassee area to maintain contact with one another and with the Tallahassee FBI Regional Office;
- 4. To provide the Tallahassee Regional Office of the FBI with other assistance which may be requested from time to time;
- 5. To conduct fundraising necessary for the corporation to defray the costs of its activities;
- 6. To make distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.
- 7. To engage in any other activities which are authorized for an organization exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.

<u>ARTICLE IV</u>

Restrictions

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable

to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons; provided, however, the corporation shall

be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make

payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III, hereof and to pay

or reimburse the reasonable expenses of fundraising and carrying out the objectives of the

corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of

propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate

or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on

behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

<u>ARTICLE V</u>

Members

Membership in the FBI Tallahassee Citizens Academy Alumni Association, Inc. shall be

open to persons who have completed FBI Citizens Academies held in the Tallahassee area and to

such other persons who may be authorized for membership in the bylaws.

ARTICLE VI

The street address and city of the registered office of the corporation is:

131 North Gadsden Street

Tallahassee, Florida 32301

The name of the initial registered agent at such address is Ronald G. Meyer, Esquire.

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ARTICLE VII Board of Directors

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors which shall consist of no fewer than three members. The number and method of selection of directors shall be prescribed in the bylaws. A Board member may serve no more than two consecutive terms. Board members shall serve with no compensation; provided, however, the Board may authorize reimbursement of expenses incurred by Board members in conjunction with the corporation's business or other approved activities directly related to the corporation's purposes.

Nothing herein shall be construed to preclude any director from receiving compensation for serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.

ARTICLE VIII Officers

The corporation shall have such officers as may be provided for in the bylaws. The manner of selection of officers shall also be provided for in the bylaws. The corporation shall have at least the following officers:

- 1. Chairperson/President
- 2. Secretary
- 3. Treasurer

Any one individual may hold more than one office in the corporation. Duties of officers shall be described in the bylaws.

ARTICLE IX Indemnification of Officers and Directors

Officers and directors shall be indemnified by the corporation as provided in the bylaws against all expenses and liabilities, including attorney's fees, (including any incurred in appellate

proceedings), reasonably incurred in connection with any proceeding or settlement thereof in which they may become involved by reason of holding such office. The corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of all officers and directors against any such liability asserted against them or incurred by them in their capacity as officers and directors or arising out of their status as such.

ARTICLE X Non-Stock Basis

This corporation is organized on a non-stock basis.

ARTICLE XI

In the event of dissolution of this corporation, the residual assets of the corporation will be turned over to one or more organizations which themselves are exempt as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or corresponding sections of any prior or future United States Internal Revenue law or to the federal, state or local government to be used for exclusively public purposes.

ARTICLE XII Amendment

Amendment of these articles shall require the approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors at a meeting of the Board. At least thirty (30) days prior to the Board meeting, the text of any proposed amendment shall be furnished to the directors of the corporation. The membership of the corporation may alter or rescind a proposed amendment by majority vote of those members present at the annual business meeting or by mail ballot furnished to the membership and decided by majority vote.
